From The Pastor

I'm writing this article during Holy Week. This week has been referred to as "the Holy of Holies." Why? Maybe the following quote can answer that.

"The object of the observance is to commemorate the last week of our Lord's life and to help the faithful in reliving it vividly, to spend these holy days and hours in that holy companionship. Yet, this is no passion play or a dramatic commemoration. It is a question of my heart, my life, my soul, in the light of that suffering. It is the Holy Week of Fulfillment.... The ancient Church knew and observed only Easter and viewed the fact of redemption as a totality. She did not separate the acts of Christ's life, death, resurrection, ascension. She did not, therefore, commemorate in this week the Suffering, at Easter the Resurrection, and forty days later the Ascension. In this celebration death and resurrection were joined and regarded as one. The viewpoint of oneness and totality has been preserved in a measure, and our Liturgy again and again sees death and glorification as one. The work of salvation does not end with death but continues into the victory of the resurrection. We must not separate the suffering from the resurrection but consider the former as the path to victory and triumph. The Liturgy in Holy Week is not merely a sorrowful wail or an outpouring of sympathy with the suffering Lord. This attitude was a product of the Middle Ages. Through the entire week breathes a victorious, joyous spirit. The suffering is no more than a passage to the glory of the resurrection. (THE SERMON AND THE PROPERS; Fred H. Lindemann, CPH, 1966)

May your participation in worship during Holy Week build up your faith in Christ. I pray that as you hear the Word of God and receive the sacrament, during this holy time, your faith is enriched and your life is drawn closer to God with the result that His will be done ever more by you. And may your time spent with God during this special week be reflected in every week of your life with God by faith in Christ.


