From The Pastor

But for me it is good to be near God; I have made the Lord God my refuge, that I may tell of all Your works.

(Psalm 73:3,5,9-11,21,22,27,28) And that is what I am doing now. Glory be to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now and shall be forever. Amen.



He Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed, Alelujah!

As I type this letter, April is winding down to an end for another year, and the winter season is a but a memory. Regarding the church calendar, we are finishing the Easter season and closing in on the season of Pentecost. Here's a reminder of the focus of the three church seasons. During Easter we focus on Jesus. Pentecost the focus is on the Holy Spirit, and Christmas, the focus is on God the Father. For a quick and basic understanding of what Pentecost Sunday is, here are 10 things that are listed regarding the holiday.

Pentecost Sunday marks the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles.

Pentecost Sunday occurs 50 days after Easter.

The Bible records the Pentecost in Acts 2:1-13.

Pentecost comes 10 days after the Ascension of Jesus Christ.

Pentecost is also known as "the birthday of the Church".

Pentecost fulfills Jesus' promise to send the "Counselor" and "Spirit of Truth" in John 16-5-15.

Pentecost launches the large-scale spreading of the Gospel after Jesus' ascension. Acts 2:41 records that after Peter spoke to the crowd after receiving the Holy Spirit, some 3,000 people were baptized.

The Pentecostal movement derives its name from the New Testament event in Acts 2.

Jews also celebrate Pentecost, but not for the same reason as Christians. The celebration by Jews of Pentecost is to observe God giving the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai 50 days after the Exodus. The Pentecost in Jewish tradition takes place 50 days after Passover.

In Western Churches, Pentecost is usually represented with the color red, which symbolizes the fire of the Holy Spirit.

Many of you were at the special voters' meeting where we unanimously decided to extend a "Divine" call to Rev. Hutchison. He has received the official call documents, and the 'letter' of the "Divine" call has been mailed to his congregation. I spoke with Rev. Hutchison a couple of times throughout the first week of the call and let him know that we would be praying for him, his family and <u>congregation</u> during his deliberation. He stated that he would add us in his prayers as well. So again, we wait <u>patiently</u> and <u>persevere</u> during this time. Whatever the result of this "Divine" call is, we need to remember that God does take care of us, His children, and He <u>will</u> provide us with our next shepherd in His time. As we pray, <u>Thy</u> will be done.....

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us.
