\$15,000

The Dwelling Place is a Christian ministry providing healing, hope to victims of domestic abuse through supportive services and a safe place to call home. The Dwelling Place exists to break the generational cycle of abuse by equipping and empowering women and children through the love of Jesus Christ so they can experience lasting freedom. They also provide transitional housing, education, food, clothing, trauma-informed supportive services, programming and mentoring for women and children. The need for their service in helping domestic women and children continues to grow. Through other generous support, another duplex has been purchased to help an additional 14 women and children in 2018. This grant will continue to support "The Dwelling House" operating funding to provide transitional housing, trauma-informed supportive service, Christian education, and programming focus on encouraging and equipping women and children to live Christ-centered lives. "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." Isaiah 41:10



Food for Backpacks

Many of our local children will be going back to school in a few weeks, for the Albert Lea School District #241, the first day of school is August 21. Did you know that there are over 200 children in the Albert Lea School District who go hungry on the weekend? For them ithe only meals, healthy and balanced, are the ones they receive during the week at school. Several churches in the community have banded together to assist these specific children through the program "Food for Backpacks." Zion and Grace Lutheran Churches are partnering in the "Food for Backpacks" program at Hawthorne Elementary School. The children will be receiving a bag of healthy food that cost \$1.31 per weekend. The program runs for thirty-four weekends during the school year. The food bags will be placed in their backpacks by the school's social worker before the kids go home for the weekend. Zion's goal is to sponsor 25 children for the 2018-2019 school year. Support this program through your prayers, picking -up, organizing, and delivering the food to school. Additionally, your financial support for this caring program will provide meals for these 25 children or more as the Lord blesses. Envelopes to support this program are in your church mailboxes or earmark your check "Food for Backpacks." Additional information on the meals is on the Community bulletin board. If you have any questions about this beneficial social ministry program, please speak with Debbie Viktora, Jodi Brown, Arlene Murray, or Pastor Matt.
