Stewardship NEWS

GIVE: God and Us

Why do we give? Is it simply because God commands us to? Or is there more to it? To be sure, the instruction and Word of God in the Bible says we should give, and this is sufficient to encourage us to give (Luke 6:38; Acts 20:35; 1 Cor. 16:2; 2 Cor. 8:7; Gal 6:6).

But there's more to it than just obligation. We're not just trying to fulfill a work of the Law. We are bearing fruits of the Spirit given to us by our Father in heaven through His Son our Lord Jesus Christ. In other words, we're not just doing what our Father said, we're also doing what He did.

Children emulate their parents. When they grow up they often carry many of the same mannerisms and characteristics as their parents, but there is more to it than that. Children copy their parents even on a more mundane level. They watch how their parents cross their legs, how they fold their hands, how they stand and sit and walk, how they do and say most everything.

And children try to copy it, which can be quite humorous when parents wish they wouldn't. It can be uncomfortable and embarrassing if a child copies or repeats something less than polite that they learned from a parent. Sitcoms thrive in these situations. It only happens because children emulate their parents because they want to be like them.

We are the children of God, by grace, through faith. In Holy Baptism, God the Father declares of us what He declared of Jesus at His Baptism in the Jordan: "You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." God the Father claims us as His own. He takes away all our sins, and in exchange, He gives us His righteousness, His purity, His holiness, and His Spirit, by which we cry out, "Abba, Father."

We are born again, born from above, born of water and the Spirit, to a new life in Christ as His children. We are sons of God in Christ, through Baptism. And since we are sons, we are heirs – heirs who share in the glory of the Son of God. The inheritance is ours because of the Father's grace and mercy, His generosity in sending His Son in time to save us for all eternity.

And this is why we give generously of our income to the work of the church. We want to be like our heavenly Father. We want to emulate His generosity by being generous ourselves. We give to the work of the Church because we have witnessed the generous giving of our Father in heaven.

More than that, we are recipients of it. It is because we have received God our Father's gifts that we desire to give ourselves. And His gifts are not just spiritual. They are temporal and earthly as well. As the Small Catechism teaches in the Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer:

"Give us this day our daily bread." What does this mean? We don't do this simply because He has commanded us so to do; it is because we, as His children by grace, want to emulate His generosity in our own lives. He is our Father; we are His children. And children want to be like their parents.

Thoughts from an Elder By Dana Nelson

Pain, Prayer and Healing

Most of you are aware of my back surgery a few weeks ago. I have been living with a spine condition and one of the problems is 'lumbar stenosis'. It has progressed over a couple of decades to be 'almost' a debilitating problem this year. I have had increased back pain, but worse, was the effect it had on my legs creating weakness and pain. When medical professionals saw the MRI, surgery was hastened as there were several locations where the spinal cord was being compressed. Laminectomies between L2 and L5 were performed as well as cleaning out the inside of a vertebra where it had grown around the spinal cord. The protective sheath around the spinal cord was worn through and scarred.

Surgery was successful in that the day after there was no more pain in my legs. I had my 2-week post-op check-up and the Dr. was pleased. The healing process continues (slowly and deliberately) and I tell everyone that every day is better than the last.

I've had some people wonder how I've been able to deal with pain. I may revert to more worldly type comments like 'mind over matter', or 'pain is inevitable, suffering is optional'. But ultimately, it's a great way I witness that Christ in my life makes 'the difference'! It's a great lead into how great a family we have at Zion, and along with that goes the caring, sharing, loving attitude. Pastor Matt asked me what I would like to pray about before surgery and my request was mainly directed towards the medical staff. The day after, he visited me (on his 'day off!') and again I was asked what should we pray about. The obvious to me was a prayer of thanksgiving. Again, I was able to share my faith with the Dr. and his staff when they checked on me the day after. When he told me things went well with surgery, I was able to tell him 'we were praying for you!'

Be bold in your witness. God places us and the Holy Spirit gives us the words.
