STEWARDSHIP

What is a steward? Most people will say a steward is a manager.

That is correct, but it is only half right. A steward is indeed a manager, but he is a manager of what does not belong to him. Someone else is the owner, and the steward manages the owner's property on the owner's behalf.

We are God's stewards. Our stewardship is that God has made us managers of what belongs to Him:

"For we brought nothing into this world, and we cannot take anything out of the world" (1 Tim. 6:7)

Everything that we have and everything that we are comes from God's fatherly divine goodness and mercy. God is the owner.

This is not only because He created all things; He is also the redeemer. He has redeemed – that is, purchased – and won all things. Therefore, it all belongs to Him.

We are simply managers of everything in this world. Like Joseph in Egypt, we are put in charge of managing what belongs to God. What a privilege.

Think about that for a minute. The all-knowing, all-powerful, all-wise God has asked us to manage his possessions on His behalf here on earth.

And by doing this, He invites us to take part in the allocation of His good gifts. He wants us to give our input and advise Him in where His gifts are to be used. What a privilege indeed.

But what a responsibility!

"Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required" (Luke 12:48b).

We are not the owners. And while He puts us as managers, we are still to do with His property what He wants done with it. That means we need to know what He desires and wills for His property.

How do we know this? How can we know the will and mind of God?

We find the will of God in the Bible. There God tells us what His will is for all of His gifts. He tells us how we are to spend our time and use our talents and treasures. He instructs us in the use of our minds, bodies, and souls.

STEWARDSHIP (CONTINUED)

There is nothing we have that doesn't belong to Him.

"Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

God informs us of the big picture, the overarching policy, of how we as His stewards – managers and custodians – are to manage His property.

And that is stewardship. It is simply doing what God wants us to do with what He has given us.

As St. Paul said,

"Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness" (Rom. 6:13).

So, let's dive into God's Word, and listen to what He desires from His stewards.

- Pioneer China missionary Hudson Taylor said, "I have found that there are three stages in every great work for God. First, it is impossible. Then, it is difficult. Then, it is done."

- What on earth are you doing for heaven's sake?
- We live in a generation where people don't blush to explain sex to their children, but do blush to explain Jesus and His death and resurrection.
- What most of us professed Christians need are fewer platitudes and better attitudes.
- If your faith won't take you to church, will it take you to heaven?
- True worship is more than sitting down and being passive and quiet. Worship is to be expressed through reaching out to others.

- **PRAYERFUL:** As a congregation and individuals, that we have a loving relationship with our heavenly Father as we are able to go to Him with all requests, concerns, and thanksgivings, through His Son Jesus Christ, our great High Priest.
- **FRUITFUL:** God expects us, as the branches connected to the Vine (John 15:1-17), to remain in Him and bear the fruit. The fruit of the Spirit among and within us, as St. Paul states love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control, again which is there is no law (Galatians 5:22-23).
- **HOPEFUL:** We always believe that because God is at work among us, as He has been over these past seventy-five years, that our brightest days are still ahead of us. "Let us keep our eyes fix on Jesus, the founder, and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:2).

Finally, members of Zion, such are the measures of our spiritual health as a congregation. Be mindful that it is good for us to measure, if not altogether tangible; as a growing body (the Body of Christ), not just a surviving organization. Thanks be to God, for we are the Body of Christ!

That is all for now, but more is come in the months ahead. In Christ, be **JOYFUL** in everything!

Welcome to a New School Year 2019/2020 for district 241 Food For Backpacks!

Backpack meals is a successful mission project. We are very proud of Zion for helping the community out in such a way that it brings smiles to the children's faces.

With the outreach program, our goal is to serve 350+ lunches in the district. The numbers fluctuate each week for the meals during the school year. The cost per meal is ~ \$3.35 per child, which we are supporting 101 children with Grace Lutheran Church. The average cost to support a child in a school year is \$155. Between Zion and Grace, we take turns monthly delivering the food to Hawthorne School.

The committee applied for grants from local businesses, to help support the program.

We are still seeking more grants from other businesses. The money that is received from these grants will be divided up among all participating churches.




