LOOKING AT TODAY'S LESSONS - The Second Sunday after the Epiphany The Lord God Is with You and Reveals Himself to You by the Preaching of His Word

The Lord Jesus calls Philip and Nathanael to "come and see" that He is "the Son of God" and "the King of Israel" (John 1:43–49). And they shall see even "greater things than these" (John 1:50). For His body is the temple of God on earth, and by His priestly sacrifice the heavens will be opened to all who believe and are baptized into Him. Therefore, He calls Philip and Nathanael, first to hear His Word and then to speak as apostles, even as He once called Samuel and established him "as a prophet of the LORD" (1 Sam. 3:20). As the Lord was with Samuel "and let none of his words fall to the ground" (1 Sam. 3:19), He also accompanies and upholds the preachers of His Word in our day. Thus, by the Gospel that is preached to you, "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you" (1 Cor. 6:19). Since your body thus belongs to the Body of Christ, is meant "for the Lord" and shall be raised up like Him, now "glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:13–20).

MEMORY VERSE FOR THE WEEK

Colossians 2:8–9 – "See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily."

OUTREACH THOUGHT

John 1:43-51: Philip's evangelism to Nathaniel consisted of three words – "Come and see!" It doesn't take a lengthy sermon or speech to witness for Christ. A friendly invitation to "come and see" may be just what someone you know is looking to hear and see. May God use your invitation to bring someone into His house or form a relationship with a believer so that they can hear the Good News of salvation through Christ!

STEWARDSHIP PONDERING

1 Corinthians 6:19b-20 – "You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body." God owns everything, including our very selves. We were made to serve Him and glorify Him and will never truly be happy or find our fulfillment until we learn that lesson. Jesus has redeemed us and brought us back into the Kingdom of the Father, and that has set us free to serve Him in joy, generosity, liberty, and faith.

FROM ZION'S TREASURER

For 1-1-20 through 12-31-20

Referring to the Income and Expense Sheet:

- 1. Actual income for the entire year of 2020 is \$201,407.48. Budgeted Income was projected at \$211,460.00
- 2. Actual Expenses for the year was \$168,167.86. Anticipated Budgeted Expenses were \$219,234.00.
- 3. This leaves us with a remaining balance of Income Less Expenses of \$33,239.62.
- 4. We are still maintaining a balance surplus for the year.



Referring to the Balance Sheet:

- 1. Ending Total Assets Balance through 12-31-20 is \$377,391.97. We started the year with \$335,241.45.
- 2. Notable restricted fund balances
 - a. Food for Backpacks balance at \$6,211.75; \$2,345.14 was spent of the program for the year.
 - b. Stain Glass Windows balance at \$10,202.00; \$6,553.00 worth of donations were made in 2020.
 - c. Mission Central contributions for year \$10,402.50
- 3. The Assets less Liabilities ending balance at \$104,667.94
- 4. The Assets less Liabilities change, matches up to the Income Less Expenses found on the Income and Expense Sheet which is \$33,239.62

SUFFICIENT FOR THE DAY

John Newton (1725-1807), author of "Amazing Grace," wrote: "We may easily manage if we will only take, each day, the burden appointed for it. But the load will ... be too heavy for us, if we carry yesterday's burden over again today, and then add tomorrow's." This maxim might be easy to dismiss unless we knew about Newton's troubled life.



Having been pressed into naval service and then slavery, Newton was finally rescued but became a slave-ship captain. He faced abuse, contemplated murder-suicide, suffered a stroke and was caught in a storm. When he cried out to God, the waves subsided, prompting a spiritual conversion for Newton, who became a priest and abolitionist.

We never know how God will transform our sinful past into future good, but we can trust he will. That adds power to Newton's advice, which echoes Jesus' words: "Sufficient for the day is its own trouble" (Matthew 6:34, ESV).
