Dear friends in Christ: A blessed May to you! And happy Mother's Day (May 10) to all women out there: mothers with children, and those who are mothers by nature. Did you know that our Lord once used the image of a mother hen to refer to His own love for us?

In Matthew 23:37 we read: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, how often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings!"

We can imagine the crucified and resurrected Christ with outstretched arms, encircling His people the church, just like the wings of a mother hen encircles her chicks. We even think of Christ's parental instincts and His desire and ability to ensure our security and protection. Gathered under the shadow of the cross and comforted in the light of Christ's empty tomb we find our greatest refuge from sin and death and the power of the devil. Psalm 91:1, 4 says: "He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty...He will cover you with His pinions, and under His wings you will find refuge."

When one thinks of a mother hen several things may come to mind; she leaves the nest only briefly each day to eat and drink and then returns to her nest to watch over her fertilized eggs. After twenty-one days, or three weeks, her chicks hatch and one can visibly observe how protective she is. She cares for and encourages the growth or development of her chicks. She finds natural foods like grass and tiny pieces of scratch or grit that are essential for the digestion of her chicks' food. A hen gives her chicks the best possible start in life. She teaches them how to eat, drink, and calls them under her wings when danger approaches, and provides warmth during the chill of the night. There are many dangers for chicks, many predators: foxes, badgers, stoats, mink, rats, cats, squirrels, and birds of prey. The hen will lay down her life for the chicks to protect them. When the

chicks grow up to be pullets, or 6-8 weeks old, the hen returns to the flock, and her fully feathered progeny are equipped to follow her example and become hens or roosters themselves.

Christ's love and protection has many attributes and aspects to it. He nurtures, feeds, comforts, warms, protects, gathers, and loves his church.

Christ as Nurturer: Nurturing is an attribute that is normally associated with mothers, but no one has ever nurtured anyone as much as Christ nurtures us through His Word and Sacraments. Nurture is defined as to "care for and encourage the growth or development of." One sees this nurturing in His use of parables to teach people, line by line, idea by idea, developing their understanding of spiritual matters. We see this in Jesus's loving teaching of Peter after he denied Him three times, acknowledging his error gently while setting him back on the path by asking him three times to feed Christ's sheep (John 21:15).

Christ as Provider: Psalm 145:15-16 speaks of God's providence, "The eyes of all wait upon thee, O Lord; and thou givest them their meat in due season. Thou openest thine hand, and satisfiest the desire of every living thing." Christ was a provider continually throughout the Gospels. There is the miraculous catch of fish when he called Peter, James and John (Luke 5:1-11). There is the feeding of the 5000, when he multiplied the five loaves and two fish, a miracle attested in all four Gospels. Christ referred to Himself as the bread from heaven, "I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live forever: and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world" (John 6:51). And then there is the Passover meal Christ celebrated with his disciples, where Christ instituted the Lord's Supper, a meal which he still feeds us today.

Christ as Comforter: The Comforter, the Holy Spirit is a gift in which Christ is present in the Word and Sacraments. Jesus promised He would send the Comforter in John 14:16-17, "And I will pray the Father and He will give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever, even the Spirit of Truth." And again, "But the Comforter, which is the Holy Spirit, which the Father will send in My name. He will teach you all things and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you. Peace I leave with you. My peace I give unto you. Not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John

14:26-27). Then He taught us to comfort each other. As 2 Corinthians 13:11 states, "Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you."

**Christ's Compassion:** One only needs to think of Christ's miracles to realize what compassion He has, even to the point of laying down of His life for us. The Gospels give us countless examples of Christ's compassion. Here are a few: the wedding at Cana and changing the water into wine (John 2:1-11), all the healing miracles, and the resurrection of Lazarus (John 11). Even the shortest verse in the Bible, "Jesus wept," points to Christ's empathy for those who suffer (John 11:35).

**Christ as Protector/Savior:** Christ alludes to His enemies as "foxes" (Luke 13:32) and in the creation account the "serpent" stalked His creation (Gen. 3:1). Christ laid down His life for us to the earthly "foxes," the Roman and Jewish hierarchy, like a hen lays down her life for her chicks. In His defeat of Satan, we see Christ as our Protector and Savior. Most importantly, He is our Victor. "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" Isaiah 41:10.

**Christ as Gatherer:** One area we see with the missionary efforts of the LCMS is the gathering of His sheep. Psalm 106:47 alludes to this gathering of those who worship Christ, "Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the nations, that we may give thanks to Your holy name and glory in Your praise." Someday the Lord will gather His people together from every diverse land into one group, one church. "Before Him will be gathered all the nations, and He will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats" (Matthew 25:32).

It would be nice to congregate once again by Mother's Day, but if not, the image of Christ gathering His church together can bless us all on Mothers' Day and every day during this Covid-19 crisis. May the peace of God that surpasses all understanding guard your heart and mind in Christ Jesus. Amen.

SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES-  
APRIL 1, 2020**

A second special meeting of the Zion Lutheran Church Council was held via phone conference call April 1, 2020 to discuss any further actions needed due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Council members participating on the conference call in addition to Pastor Hinckley were Rocky Knippling, Tom Schmidt, Jim Ristau, Darrel DuVall, Rick Hargens, Kurt Kelsey, Todd Van Den Bosch, Mark Klein, Joe Mason, Mike Reimer, Chisum Peterson, Phil Wendling, Marsha Houska and Charles Swanson. The special meeting was called to order by Chairman Chisum Peterson at 7 PM. Pastor opened the meeting with a reading from Phil 1 and prayer.

Pastor Hinckley reported he has done an online fire-side chat and an abbreviated service which Susan posted links to on line. (reported through Google analyst that 45 users viewed the Sunday service to date.)

Items discussed:

- In need of money counter to count and deposit offerings mailed or dropped off at the church
- Secretary Susan working primarily from home
- Continued suspension of church activities
- Easter services options including ZOOM meeting
- Majority of circuit canceling Easter activities



### Rev. Mueller spoke at Zion for a centennial service in 2017

The Rev. Dr. Herbert Christian Mueller Jr., former first vice-president of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), died March 21. He was 66.

Mueller was born on May 16, 1953, to the Rev. Herbert C.

Mueller Sr. and Ruth (Polley) Mueller, in Grand Forks, N.D. He earned an associate's degree (1973) from Concordia College, Ann Arbor, Mich.; a Bachelor of Arts (1975) from Concordia Senior College, Fort Wayne, Ind.; and a Master of Divinity (1979) from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He was also honored with a Doctor of Divinity degree (honoris causa) from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, in 2012.

On June 21, 1975, he married Faith Anderson at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Bay City, Mich.

After his ordination, Mueller was called to Mount Calvary Lutheran Church in Chicago, where he served from 1979 to 1983. He then served as pastor at Zion Lutheran Church, Bethalto, Ill., from 1983 to 1990; and at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Waterloo, Ill., from 1990 to 1994.

In 1994, he was elected president of the LCMS Southern Illinois District (SID), beginning his 25 years of service on the LCMS Council of Presidents (COP). After six terms serving as SID president, he was elected in 2010 as first vice-president of the LCMS, where he served three terms (re-elected in 2013 and 2016) until his retirement in August 2019. In his years serving on the COP, he attended 101 board meetings and over 50 Call Day services.

Prior to his election as district president, Mueller had served the SID as secretary and district vice-president. He had also served as chairman of the LCMS Commission on Ministerial Growth and Support, and as a member of the Program Committee for the COP. Between 1997 and 2004, he was instrumental in developing a mission partnership between the SID and the Lutheran Church in South Africa.

“Herb was a gift,” said LCMS President Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison. “We served the church together for a decade. He made me a better man, a better Christian, a better churchman and a better president.

“He confronted the hand God dealt him with deep faith in Christ’s resurrection, certainty of forgiveness and his own resurrection, great love for his wife and family, love for the church, and humor. The greatest gift was that he showed us how a Christian dies. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.”

“Rev. Mueller valued holding on to one another in Christ and working to reconcile our differences under the cross of Jesus,” said the Rev. Timothy Scharr, Mueller’s successor as the SID president. “This was at the core of the Koinonia Project he instituted. He wanted The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod to be confident and live out the faith that it so boldly confesses.”

“At a district convention some years ago,” said the Rev. Benjamin T. Ball, LCMS sixth vice-president, “I was ‘hot and bothered’ about some issue. He took me aside and reminded me that our Lord Jesus Christ is the Lord of the church, and that he will care for his people and shepherd the flock. And Herb showed me that he cared for me, not just the issue at hand. He wanted me to be at peace. And that has always stuck with me.”

“He was the consummate pastor,” Ball continued, “always trying to focus people on Christ, the Gospel, the Holy Scriptures. And he did that in so many ways, as a parish pastor, as a district president, and of course as Synod vice-president. His influence is going to be felt in the Synod for years and years to come.”

Mueller is survived by his mother, Ruth; his wife, Faith; children Rev. Herbert C. (Kristen) Mueller III of Westgate, Iowa; Nathan (Aimee) Mueller of Archer, Iowa; and Carol (Michael) Scheck of LaPorte, Ind.; six siblings; nephews and nieces; and six grandchildren.
