What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 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THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD (First Sunday after the Epiphany)

In Holy Baptism, the Triune God Reveals Himself and Recreates Us in His Image

“In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth” (Gen. 1:1). Then, as *“the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters”* (Gen. 1:2), God spoke His Word: *“Let there be light, and there was light”* (Gen. 1:3). In the same way, *“the beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ”* (Mark 1:1) brings about the new creation through the waters of Baptism by the same Word and Spirit of God. When John the Baptist came, *“proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins,”* Jesus also came *“and was baptized by John in the Jordan”* (Mark 1:4, 9). Although He had no sins of His own, He took His stand with sinners in His Baptism and took the sins and mortality of the world upon Himself. He was baptized into His own death, by which the heavens are opened and the Spirit is given to us. God the Father is well pleased with His beloved Son and raises Him from the dead. As we share His Baptism and are *“united with him in a death like his”* (Rom. 6:5), we also share His resurrection unto *“newness of life”* (Rom. 6:4).



Holy Communion Distribution: During this time, we are practicing a walk-thru style for the distribution of Holy Communion. What this means is that every family will approach the rail one at a time. The Usher/Elder will acknowledge you and you may come forward to your respective rail.

When at the rail, it is appropriate to bow out of reverence to the Lord.

Then the Pastor and Elder will distribute the Sacrament to you. Once you have received the Sacrament you dismiss yourself and return to your pew, placing the receptacle in the tray as you go. The Pastor will speak a blessing for the entire congregation at the end of the distribution. If you have any questions, you may ask the Pastor or the Elders and they will assist you. Thank you for your understanding and patience, and the Lord be with you!
