A Letter for Children, Youth, and Their Parents and Guardians

Who are You?

This month many of you will be starting school again, and one of the first things you are asked in a new classroom, whether in Kindergarten or High School, is what is your name? Who are you? A lot of people will associate who you are by your surname. Your family may have been here for decades or many generations. Another way that you might be known is where you live, on a family farm, or a certain street. What if you were as well-known in another way? What if the way you spoke, the way you dressed and appeared, made someone else aware that you are also known by a different name, that you have taken upon you the name of Christ, and that you are His, just as much as you belong to your family. You are a child of God, through Christ, through holy baptism, and you have taken upon you His name and His attributes.

1 John 3:1-3

“See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is. And everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure.”

What we learn from this is that being like Christ, and a child of God, is not something anyone can earn, it is a gift of God. Jesus himself has said, “Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect” Matthew 5:48. As we speak of perfection, there is much to consider. One must be the soul of honor, full of integrity, above reproach, yet also humble. We are to be perfect even as He is perfect. This is a promise of what we can be *eventually*, it is a goal to reach for that we will not be able to reach until we are perfected in Him, when He appears again.

Take one of the suggested themes and Scriptures below and study it together as a family, I recommend reading and talking about one every night. It will take about ten minutes. You do not have to be a master theologian to be able to talk to your family about spiritual things and to read together in the Bible. It will bring the Holy Spirit into your home! The Spirit brings with it many spiritual gifts that will help purify you and make your family more peaceful and loving. Let's Learn our ABCs! For extra fun, come up with your own ABC list of attributes of being a child of God.

Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophecy when the council of elders laid their hands on you. Practice these things, immerse yourself in them, so that all may see your progress. Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers.”

May His words give you courage in doing what is right every day, wherever you may be, and whoever you are with, this is my prayer for you all!


New Business:

When it comes to stewardship, a favorite Bible verse is the account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1–4). It's a moving account. Our Lord praises the seemingly small gift of two copper coins given by a poor widow above the abundance of gifts given by the rich, saying, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them" (Luke 21:3). And that is usually where we stop. But the text goes on. "For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:4).

"She ... put in all she had to live on." She gave everything. She held nothing back. She trusted that the Lord who made her and all creatures; who gave her everything she had; who redeemed her from her own sin, from death, and the power of the devil; who called her by the gospel and enlightened her with His gifts of Word and Sacrament; would continue to do this. He would provide her with all that she needed for this body and life because that is the character of the God she had.

But this is not why we give small gifts. Her gift, though it appeared small, was actually large. When we are tempted to give small gifts, it is precisely because we want them to be small! We don't trust the Lord to provide for us. We give small gifts because we lack faith in the One who created us, redeemed us, sanctifies and keeps us in the one true faith. We give small gifts because we doubt that God will really give us what we need and desire. We give small gifts because we are not content with what God has already given.

We are not slaves, children of the slave woman, under the Old Covenant (Galatians 4). We are adopted sons of the free woman. And since we are sons, we are also heirs. And heirs receive the inheritance. For everything is already ours in Christ. And thus, moved by the willing spirit of adoption, we do the will of God in financial matters far beyond all that done by those under the Old Covenant who were forced by legal demands.

So, what have you decided to give? How do I decide what to give? Let the Scriptures be your guide.

We are to give proportionally to what we have received from God's giving to us (Luke 12:48; 1 Corinthians 16:1–2, 2 Corinthians 8:12). But you have not been set free to give nothing. See that you excel in the grace of giving (2 Corinthians 8:7)!

We are not free to live selfishly outside the Gospel, without regard for God who gives us all good gifts, without generosity for our neighbor who needs us and our gifts, without supporting the community of faith in which we live, without care for our spiritual fathers and those who teach and help raise our children in the faith, and without resources for the poor and needy.

In short, we are not free to live unto ourselves, hoarding what God has given us only for us. For love is the fulfillment of the law (Romans 13:10). And the sum of the law is this: Love God and love your neighbor (Matthew 22:34–40). We love because He first loved us. We give because He has given to us.

Luther once said, "Possessions belong in your hands, not in your heart" (LW 14:240). There is a reason your 10 fingers spread apart. With your hands you catch God's gifts for what you need and let the rest fall through your fingers to your neighbors – your family, your friends, your community, your church.



“Fear Not! I Am with You”

NOISE! It is deafening and scary! If one gives even a little attention to anything going on in America and in the world today, it is quite evident that the noise is the age old spiritual battle of good versus evil.

“For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places” (Ephesians 6:12).

The fight for the sanctity of life has always been a spiritual battle, but it seems the evil forces have “upped the ante” over the last year. Or maybe not. Perhaps our spiritual eyes are being opened wider to see the evil more clearly.

Either way, fear seems to be the result. Fear is a powerful motivator, as we have all witnessed. (Fear, uncertainty, and doubt, wrought by Satan, have caused havoc of disastrous proportions worldwide.)

F.E.A.R. (False Evidence Appearing Real). It seems to be an appropriate acronym, fitting right in line with the “father of lies” (Satan). The “father of lies” is very clever and has been weaving his lies for centuries and accusing God’s children, trying to make us more fearful. The more “NOISE” and “False Evidence” Satan makes and tells, the more fearful we become.

As a nurse, much of my job includes educating the people that I care for. That education may relate to a procedure, medication, proper care and nutrition for the body, or even the process of labor and delivery of a newborn baby. Fear often comes from the unknown. Therefore, education and knowledge are power to help overcome feelings of fear and suffering.

It is no different for the Christian. Our Heavenly Father knows this and sent the Holy Spirit to comfort us in our fears and enlighten us in the truths of God’s Holy Word, which includes donning the whole armor of God to stand as sentries.

“[B]e strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil ... Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm ... praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end,

keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints” (Ephesians 6:10-18).

“As members of God’s holy, priestly people we are soldiers of Christ engaged in spiritual warfare with him on planet earth (cf. 1 Timothy 1:19, 6:12; 2 Timothy 2:3-4, 4-7). As Christ’s soldiers our duty is to protect ourselves and others by doing sentry duty, guarding the holy territory which Christ has conquered. Our basic sentry duty task is to stand on guard where Christ has placed us and to stay awake as we watch against surprise attacks from the enemy (Satan and spiritual powers of darkness under his control), by praying for ourselves and others, borrowing Christ’s priestly armor and God’s Word (our only offensive weapon).” *From Australian Lutheran College Course Book for “Lutheran Spirituality” by Rev. Dr. John W. Kleinig.**

How comforting! We should have no fear! God has got this! All we have to do is keep our armor on and stand as sentries in prayer! God’s Word tells us numerous times, “FEAR NOT”! **“Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you”** (Luke 10:19).

Tune out the NOISE of the lies, bury yourself deep into God’s Word of truth, and go forth with the life-affirming message, donned in Christ’s priestly armor and standing as sentry in prayer!


