## God is Love

Dear Christian friends!

Although Valentine's Day is not officially part of the Church calendar, the subject deserves mention for the simple reason that love, and marriage are gifts from God. Indeed, 1 John chapter 4:8 says that God is love. God Himself is the author and source of love. He is also the author and source of marriage. Genesis chapters 1 and 2 show how God created man and woman for each other and gave them a blessing to be fruitful and multiply (Gen 1:28). God purposefully brought the man and woman together (Gen 2:22), not only for companionship but for procreation, as Christ Himself says "the two shall become one flesh" (Mat 19:5), and that is profoundly true both physically and spiritually.

In this way we understand that love has a purpose, it is not created for itself, but is always giving to and serving another. Love is to be shared. It is both a noun and a verb. So, we have the love of God, the eternal love of the Father and the Son (John 5:20; 17:24), and the Spirit (Mat 28:19; Rom 5:5). This love is shared between the members of the Holy Trinity and is what unites them. St. John expresses this mystery in a marvelously simple statement: God is love (1 John 4:8). Furthermore, John 3:16 clearly states that it was out of love that God sent His only-begotten Son into the world to be our Savior. 1 John chapter 4:9-10 explains: "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins." Jesus reveals the love of God to us. In His birth, life, ministry, death, resurrection, ascension, in fact, in everything He did, Jesus showed us the love of God. And this love He shares with us today in the Gospel and the Sacraments. Through Baptism and the Lord's Supper, through Absolution and the preaching of the Gospel, and in many other ways, our Lord loves us. He is the revelation of love in the world today.

It should not surprise us that Jesus' first miracle was at a wedding in Cana, where He had compassion on his friends, and indeed, we might say, He showed His love for them. They had no more wine (John 2:3). At this special and festive celebration, the wedding couple was at a loss to provide for their guests. But one thing they had done right, they had invited Jesus to their wedding, and by His presence and blessing, their lives were forever changed for the better.

The Greek language has three words for love which describe the different nuances of its character: *αγαπε* (agape), which is a sacrificial, giving of oneself for another sort of love; *φιλεω* (phileo), which is the brotherly or familial love; and *ερος* (eros), from which we get erotic or sexual relations. Agape is the word used in the New Testament to describe the love of God in Christ Jesus, as in John 3:16 and many other passages. Jesus gave His life for us, "greater love (agape) has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13).

"Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love" (1 John 4:7-8). The love between a husband and wife, the love between brothers and sisters, the love of family, the love of country, the love between fellow Christians, all of it my dear friends, reflects the love God has for us in His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom be all praise and honor and glory, Amen!

As Robert studied the pin and read the attached card, it was obvious that feelings and memories were flooding his heart and mind. I didn't push him for any details, but through his choked back tears, he couldn't find words to thank me enough.

Throughout the weekend event Robert, my husband, and I talked small-talk and exchanged contact information. About a week later, Robert called me and shared his story of how, regretfully, he had been involved in two abortions of his own children from a long-gone relationship. The timely Precious Feet gift, given to him at this special Christian event, helped him come to terms with his past, and with repentance, God brought forgiveness and healing into his soul that even allowed him to name his aborted children.

It was true, I did not realize the impact that this simple gesture would have on this precious new friend that God brought into my life. I will be forever humbled that God chose me and my simple gesture to help bring God's healing and peace to this man.

*"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit"*  
(John 15:16).

Those words are meant for every one of us. We should never cease to be amazed at God's gifts and timing to bear the fruit of God's love.

## The Word for Your New Year

Soon, we will (or perhaps we already have) see and hear what people are resolving to accomplish in the next year. In the past few years, I've noticed a new way to make resolutions. Along with resolution statements, some people are selecting a "word for the year." Some resolution makers see this word selection as a word from God or some self-proclaiming prophecy.

### A New Word for the New Year

I've seen words such as *resilient*, *vision*, *peace*, or *presence* selected. I have no idea how the year went for those who selected those words. I'm certain, however, that their whole year was filled with peace. I'm sure there were times when they felt scattered instead of present. Regardless of how strong we are, there are times in life when we are broken instead of resilient. We often have a plan for what the next year will be like, but reality always looks different than the plans we make.

As with many trends, I jumped in and participated in selecting a "word for the year." I didn't see it as a way to prophesy about my upcoming year or as a word from God. I can't even recall what word I selected at the beginning of 2021. I'm a writer, and I love words. It seemed like a natural way to make a resolution without getting overwhelmed. Despite not being able to remember the word I selected a year ago, I did find it helpful when looking at the work of my different vocations. It was a practical tool for organizing my upcoming year and deciding what could reasonably be accomplished.

### The Word for 2022: *Jesus*

While some may find this trend helpful, we do not need to select a word for the new year. We already have the Word, Jesus, who has given Himself to us. His work on our behalf provides everything we need.

John 1:1–5; 14–18 reads:

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and

without Him was not anything made that was made. In Him was life, and life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. . . .

The word we need this year and next year is and always has been *Jesus*. The Word created us, shines on us, became flesh and dwelt among us, revealed His glory, made us right with our heavenly Father, and gives us grace upon grace.

We cannot choose a word and create or prophesy peace, resilience, or any other concept we imagine. The Word, Jesus, is the only one who can create good things in our lives. He uses us, His creation, to serve one another. We rely on the Word and His pronunciation of forgiveness in our lives.

We do not need to choose a word because the Word has given Himself to us.

Because of the work of the Word, Christ, we begin each day, week, month, and year from a place of forgiveness. In that forgiveness, we have the freedom to set goals, work in our vocations, and serve our neighbors because of the work the Word does in our lives.

Scripture: ESV®.

**God in Man Made Manifest**

The season of Epiphany focuses on how God was made manifest in the flesh of Jesus. The church spends time hearing of the miracles, signs, and wonders of Jesus in the world. And this made plain to all that Jesus really is who He said He was. He is the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, the only begotten Son of the Father, in the flesh. For “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us” (John 1:14).

It is revealed for all the world to see that Jesus is God in the flesh. It is made manifest by His words and His work, by what He said and by what He did. And these belong together, for “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.” Jesus is the Word and will of God in the flesh, that is, He is the walking, talking enactment of God’s Word.

It is no different for us. We are called not just to believe in God in hearts but also to trust in God in word and deed. As James wrote: “But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves” (James 1:22), and again, “What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? ... So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. ... Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works. ... For as the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead” (James 2:14, 17–18, 26).

Our faith is lived out in works for our neighbor. Our trust in the Word and will of God is lived out not in word only but also in deed and in truth. In other words, the Epiphany of the Lord creates in us an epiphany of our faith in our works of obedience to God who commanded them. By this, our faith is made manifest to the world. It is, as Luther wrote of faith:

Faith is a divine work in us. It changes us and makes us to be born anew of God (John 1). It kills the old Adam and makes altogether different people, in heart and spirit and mind and powers, and it brings with it the Holy Spirit.

Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith. And so it is impossible for it not to do good works incessantly. It does not ask whether there are good works to do, but before the question rises, it has already done them, and is always at the doing of them.

He who does not these works is a faithless man. He gropes and looks about after faith and good works and knows neither what faith is nor what good works are, though he talks and talks, with many words about faith and good works.

Faith is a living, daring confidence in God’s grace, so sure and certain that a man would stake his life on it a thousand times. This confidence in God’s grace and knowledge of it makes men glad and bold and happy in dealing with God and all His creatures. And this is the work of the Holy Spirit in faith. Hence a man is ready and glad, without compulsion, to do good to everyone, to serve everyone, to suffer everything, in love and praise to God, who has shown him this grace.

And thus it is impossible to separate works from faith, quite as impossible as to separate burning and shining from fire. Beware, therefore, of your own false notions and of the idle talkers, who would be wise enough to make decisions about faith and good works, and yet are the greatest fools. (*Preface to the Book of Romans*)

So, then, let our faith be active by God’s power in the Word through the Holy Spirit. And let then our faith be made manifest to the world by what this faith does: serving our neighbor – in church, in the family, and society – with the works of faith in time, talents, and treasures.




