This Present Moment

*“Blessed are you, spring,
Like Jesus, standing before the tomb of Lazarus,
You call to us: “Remove winter’s stone, come out,
There is life here you have not yet tasted.”*

This is a stanza from “A Spring Blessing” written by Joyce Rupp and Macrina Wiederkehr. As I write this in mid-March, the piles of dirty snow are finally dwindling away (hopefully for good) after a longer winter than this area has seen in quite a while. I think most of us are glad to see winter go. These last few months have resulted in cabin fever for many and some unfortunate falls on the ice. In April, we feel ourselves on the cusp of spring. And with Holy Week drawing close, we prepare to travel with Jesus to the cross and tomb.

This Easter is a special one at Zion. As we celebrate Jesus’ victory over sin and death, we do so this year with a new senior pastor. This marks a new chapter in the life of our community. Pastor Debner’s arrival brings much anticipation and excitement and lots of questions. What is she like? What new emphases and ministry will flourish under her leadership? What will change at Zion? What will remain the same? I really don’t have answers to any of these questions. Only time and the Holy Spirit will reveal this to us. But I do know what often happens in churches after an extended time of being in flux. When the vote is counted and the call accepted by the new pastor, members of the congregation give a big sigh of relief. After all the hard work of the call committee and of lay members stepping up and shouldering responsibility, most people are ready to relax and take a break. The work is done, right? The new senior pastor is here. She will do it. She’ll make sure everything gets done.

This couldn’t be further from the truth. We cannot expect Pastor Debner to fly in like a super hero, pick up the mantle, and do all the heavy lifting. Zion’s mission is something that we all share, for which we all are responsible. In our calling her here, we believe that God has sent her to lead us in carrying out this mission. Now is not the time to step back, but to engage further. As our senior pastor, she needs the chance to get to know us, to learn what we are passionate about, to hear what’s happening in our local community, and how Zion already embodies the good news of Jesus through our worship, outreach, teaching the faith, and care within our community. And we need the chance to get to know her, to learn what gifts she brings to Zion and what fresh insights she has as she enters this community. Only then, can she help us listen to the Spirit and see what God is calling us to do next.

Easter is the time of new beginnings. And as the poem suggests, there is new life here that we have not yet tasted. I encourage you over these next months to not step back, but instead to step forward. Let us give ourselves full-heartedly to Zion’s ministry. Let us build a strong partnership with our new leader and together pursue the mission to which we have been called. God has much in store for us if we have ears to hear and eyes to see and the will to follow where our risen Lord is leading us.

Church World Service, which administers CROP Walk programs has earned a 4 star rating from Charity Navigator, so your donations will reach those in need.

Hungry people in developing countries typically walk as many as six miles a day to get food, water, fuel, and to take their goods to market. We walk in solidarity with them as they struggle for their existence.
