For decades Zion members led, delivered messages of love, wheeled residents to and from services, sang, and played music at Clove Lakes and at Golden Gate. Some members brought their children to teach them about caring for the elderly and disabled in our community. That ministry is in decline now. Only a few members (Joan and Fred Crisson, and Ole Olsen) now lead worship services just twice a month at Clove Lakes. Members of Salem Church now conduct services the rest of the month. It would be a shame to let this ministry go. The residents love coming to "church" each week to sing their favorite hymns and hear a message of love!

Joan, Fred, and Ole can use some help! Ole goes away each year January through April. Joan and Fred would be happy to be able to take a break now and then. Please consider whether you'd be willing to help our friends in this ministry. It's not difficult. It doesn't take a lot of your time. January 2020 Operations Committee Update

Hello and Happy New Year!

Please note the following the following information as discussed at the December 2019 meeting of the Operation and Finance Committee:

<u>Rental Agent Report</u>: Our rental Agent (Kevin Borgersen) reported that sports rentals of our facility have increased and as such, the gym will be in use for this purpose most weeknights.

<u>Unemployment Insurance</u>: Pastor John (as a member of the Operations Committee) has been working closely with our insurance broker (Mike Jakobs) to address and rectify past Unemployment Insurance coverage issues with the Preschool. Presently, both the Church and the Preschool are in full compliance with the required insurance.

<u>**Telephone systems</u>**: Due to a number of issues with our former phone company, we have (over the past few months) been working to migrate our phone and technical support to a new company. Our new service provider will save the church approximately \$1,200 annually as part of our basic monthly charge. A greater savings to the church will come from the fact that repairs and service are covered under our new contract. (With our former provider, we paid for all service calls.) This can essentially amount to a few thousand in savings over the course of the coming year.</u>

<u>St Paul's/St Luke's (SPSL)/Zion merger</u>: The "Merger Committee," which consists of members from **SP/SL** (Nancy Giovanazzo, Doris Spinelli and Doris Virga) and members from **Zion** (Council President, Sandra Mormile, Council VP, Carole Larsen, Operations Chair, David Thorsen and Pastor Saraka) have been meeting on a monthly basis to discuss the steps that must be followed in order to proceed with the merger. It appears at this point that the best way to proceed is for the members of St. Paul's/St. Luke's to become members of Zion (absorbed into our congregation) and gift their church and parsonage to Zion – who would than undertake the fiduciary responsibilities of maintaining those assets.

Both **Zion** and **SP/SL** are in the process of reviewing their financial and administrative documents in preparation for the merger. While the members of St Paul's/St Luke's and Zion are already one family in reality, we hope to formalize the details within this new year - pending synod approval and Attorney General approval of the plan of action we present.

<u>Pre-Audit Review:</u> As our finances have now been organized into a "Chart of Accounts," we are now ready to begin our Pre-Audit review with our accountant, Gregg Iliceto. This review covers both finances and practices connected to the financial management within the Church and recommendations for going forward with our financial organization will be brought to the congregation by our accountant - Mr. Iliceto.

Zion Preschool:

- <u>Enrollment</u>: Our current enrollment in various preschool programs is approximately 100. this is close to the historic average full capacity of 125.
- <u>Preschool Director applications</u>: We have received a number of highly qualified applications for the Preschool Director position, and interviews are ongoing. The initial interview committee consists of the

Pastor, Council President, Operations& Finance Chair and the Preschool Subcommittee Chair. The second level (round) of interviews, will include 2 more members (1 from the Operations and Finance Committee and 1 from Council).

<u>Chime repair</u>: We need to recheck the wires on the roof going to the speakers. The rest of the system is functional. Unfortunately, our electrician (Bill Funk) hurt his ankle mid-December, and we have to wait until he can safely navigate the ladders on the roof.

Lighting in the parking lot: The church will rent a "genie lift device" in order to be able to safely change the lights in the parking lot.

No smoking signs on campus: It was noted that we do not have "No Smoking Signs" on display on the church grounds. The signs are on order and will be posted shortly.

Entrance/Exit Signs: Proper entrance and exit signs are being made for the Church entrance and preschool entrance and exit.

Church "Illumination" Fund Raiser:

We are engaging in an effort to enhance the lighting of the exterior of the church., As such we will be holding fund raisers to earn funds to purchase more wall sconces, etc. for the exterior walls of the Church, Lamp post and additional lighting at the parking lot entrance for night driving will also be added. We are also planning to install extra lighting and timed switches (to keep the lights on a schedule) so that our beautiful stain glass windows can serve as a beacon of light and welcome to all the members of our community.

A special thank you to Tom and Jayne Warren Martinsen for the generous donation they gave to the "Lighting Fund" in memory of their family and for the many wonderful years in which they grew up within Zion's family.

<u>Church "Sound System" Fundraiser</u>: After many years of service, our sound system is at the end of it operational life and as such we have noticed periodic failures in the quality of sound during our services. An estimate to replace the system has come in at approximately 10,000 dollars. The Operations Committee has started a fund-raising drive to help cover the cost of this system. if interested in donating to this fund, please contact.

Zion's traditional Faith-based Early Education Programs for 2, 3 and 4's will be offered this fall. When considering your child's placement at Zion, please consider your first choice for class and time, but be planful and have a back-up choice in mind. It is our sincerest desire to work with each family to best meet the needs of the student and also the parents schedule, but reality dictates that sometimes a second choice is needed. Please check our preschool website and Facebook page which will be continually updated and will maintain the most current information:

Registration for all of Zion's faith-based programs will begin in late January using the school's on-line EZCare Web-Link and will be on a first come/first served basis. At 4:00 pm on the day assigned, your registration link will become live. A reminder will be sent out to current families via the Remind app, an email notification, posted on the school's Facebook page and on the website.

The order of priority registration for all of our Programs is below. Registration will remain open until all seats are filled. Should you have any problems registering, simply reach out to the office and a staff member will assist you We want this process to be easy and efficient for all parents. PLEASE do not try to register prior to your correct category. If you have a particular issue with your assigned time, please call the office for assistance.

Note: To secure your child's placement, a non-refundable registration fee of \$100 along with a tuition deposit of \$500 will be due at registration. The balance of the tuition due will be paid evenly over 12 months (June-May). A 10% discount will be applied to the lesser or equal program tuition amount when siblings are registered for the same school year.
