LUTHERANS IN AFRICA

Forming African Christians to Be Teachers of The Faith

The church in Africa is growing by leaps and bound. And the Church in Africa is the target of both wily and audacious attacks of our foe. Caught in the middle are the men, women, and children hungry to hear God's Truth. The Book of Con*cord*, the Confessions of our faith, is a beautiful litany of Christ crucified and what that means in our lives. Our Church fathers fought fiercely to strip out the things of man and restore to the doctrine of the Church the things of God. The unique starting point of Lutheran doctrine is to always ask, "What does the Bible say?" Therefore the mission of Lutherans in Africa (LIA) is to train Lutheran teachers in Africa to respond with Biblical answers not human philosophy. We do this by providing educational seminars and workshops for current clergy and church staff, and by the dissemination of key doctrinal resources, including their translation into African languages where needed. It is in this way LIA believes we can help preserve the legacy of our faith unto the generations to come. Thus, LIA was founded in 2010 to aid in the preaching and teaching of the confessional Lutheran faith across Africa.
