Advent



*"I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God,
"who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."
(Revelation 1:8)*

Advent is the season of preparation for the Lord "Who is and Who was and Who is to come, The Almighty." Notice that Jesus describes Himself as the present, the past, and the future-! Most history timelines begin in the past, ponder the present, and look forward to the future. Jesus, who is the beginning and the end, picks up the Name God gave to Moses from the burning bush (Exo 3:14), and fully establishes Himself in the present. He is "I Am". He is the God "Who is." He is a present help in times of trouble. (Psalm 46:1) He is not far off. He is not uninterested; He is not too busy. He offers Himself here and now, for us!

What does this mean? Yes, it is true that we prepare to celebrate that Jesus was born at Christmas. What joy for the world that the Lord has come to bring us peace through the forgiveness of our sins. That is a celebration we do well to prepare for.

Yet, we should not forget that He is **come** for us here and now. He is with us. He is with us in His Word and His Holy Communion. He is a present help for us in the midst of this present darkness. What He has done is accomplished. What He will do is promised. What He is doing is being with us. God with us-- Emmanuel. He is with us as our righteousness. He is with us as our redeemer. He is with us as the Good Shepherd. He is with us as the bread of life. He is with us as the most relevant truth. He is with us as the God of love.



Board of Education Report

We have compiled the page for home-based Sunday School. Ages three to five years have received two Arch books, the fourteen lessons and guide for parents, plus stickers for each lesson. When I delivered one bag to a home the student was eager to begin.

The seven and eight year olds received a Children's Bible, fourteen lessons, plus two Arch books. We plan to supplement these lessons again next Fall. The lessons for this year begin with Creation and end with: The King's Table - Mephibosheth, Genesis through Exodus, Joshua, Judges, I and 2 Samuel 9:1-13 are covered.

All students have received a CD of songs - 40 songs based on the Apostles Creed. All Christian songs are ideal for early elementary classrooms, Sunday School, and at home or in the car.

We have received a sample of the Enduring Faith Religion Curriculum - a preview for grades five through eight also. We hope to continue with these next year. The Sunday School age children and youth have been compiled by Laurie and myself for a clearer listing for the BoD and Pastor.

I thank Laurie in the office for her help in choosing and ordering these supplies and the devotional books for three teenagers that attend our church.


Poinsettias




Open House

Lynne Hereth Steps Down from Choir Involvement

Greetings Pastor Stults, Zion congregation leaders and members of the congregation.

As I move forward toward fewer complications in my life, I am reminded of how much of my life has been, and will be, shaped by Zion Lutheran Church. I thank you all for that. Many of you have been with me the entire journey.

Sometime in the early 1980s I joined the Zion church choir as an outlet for a desire to be part of a vocal group rooted in the church. Once a week for practice, and almost every Sunday, the choir members fellowshiped, learned more about the role of music in the church, and offered our voices to God. Early on I was coached by the members in music leadership. After each church music director moved on, I continued as a music “cheerleader” (I have no formal training in choir directing) as I filled in for choir directors and added some individual music. With encouragement from Kathy and Gary Gable, I have continued to provide any input and suggestions I had to keep music, in addition to the organ and piano, accessible to congregation members. During several years when we did not have accompaniment for the music the choir could sing as such a small group, the Board of Directors provided budget money for pre-recorded accompaniment that was played over speakers. We certainly had fun with that variety and were allowed to continue with our talented and committed members. Last year, when Pastor Stults and his family arrived, I was instantly thankful for Tyleen and her accompaniment skills, and the entire family for their gifts and commitment to quality music. But, my life has taken me north of Zion.

It is with sadness, but with thanks to Zion, that I make clear that I cannot continue with music at Zion. I now live in Burlington, about an hour drive from the church, and the commute for me is no longer reasonable. As the darker months approach, mid-week practices and special services are not wise for me to pursue. Currently, I am recovering from knee surgery that will not have me navigating on my own for several weeks. In the meantime, I am looking into congregations in the Mount Vernon area to resume the weekly worship that I am missing in my life.

You all have blessed me with so much acceptance, willingness and appreciation for the music. I pray the best person will take Zion’s choir music forward. Kathy Gable has all the music we purchased which she has organized and made accessible to the needs of the church. She has been such an encouragement for me and is the perfect resource.

“Anxiety vs. Trust”

Jesus, in His Sermon on the Mount, teaches those who follow Him that worrying about the necessities of life is idolatry: worshipping a false god. Worry and anxiety show what we care about. Our anxiety reveals what we love and what we’re devoted to. It reveals what we trust in.

This is why our Lord begins this section with an overarching principle: “No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money” (Matt. 6:24).

But you say: “I must eat and drink. I must have clothing to wear and have a home in which to dwell.” Yes, all these things you need. And Jesus says that your Father in heaven will ensure that you have them. He demonstrates this with a simple argument: your Father in heaven feeds the birds of the air, who neither sow, nor reap, nor gather into barns. He clothes the lilies of the field, who neither toil nor spin but are arrayed more luxuriously than Solomon in all his glory. If, then, your Father in heaven feeds the birds, if He clothes the lilies, how will He not also feed and clothe you, when you are worth more than they are? (Matt 6:25–33).

Do you know that you are worth more than them? You are worth infinitely more. You are worth the price of the eternal Son of God. Did the Son of God come down from heaven and become a lily? Did he descend and take on the form of a bird? No! He came down from heaven and became a man: flesh of our flesh and bone of our bone (Gen. 2:23). He is one of us, our brother. And what did He do when He became flesh to dwell among us? He gave His holy, precious blood, through His innocent suffering and death, that you might be His own and live under Him in His kingdom forever.

God became man in Christ Jesus. He lived the life we failed to live, and He died the death we deserved. He was raised again on the third day overcoming sin and death ... for us. He was crucified for our transgressions and raised for our justification. So, if your Father in heaven has given His Son to die for us

in order that we might live with Him eternally, how will He not also give us all things to support this body and life?

To be anxious about the necessities of life, to devote yourself to food and clothing, to care about these things and find security in them, is to serve another god. It is to deny that you will live forever because Jesus, the Son of God, is risen from the dead and lives and reigns for all eternity. It is to believe that the God who created you, redeemed you by the death and resurrection of His Son and sanctified you by His Spirit, will not keep His promise to sustain you in this life.

Jesus says, “Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness” (Matt. 6:33). God’s kingdom is His rule among us. His rule among us comes when our Father in heaven gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His Holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity. This is what we ask God to do for us in the prayer that Jesus taught us.

Your Father in heaven knows what you need — food and clothing, house and home — and He promises to give it to you. Chief of the things you need is His grace and mercy in His Son, Jesus Christ. So, seek after that. And those who seek will find. And all the necessities of life, our Lord says, will be added to you.

Lutheran Bible Translators - \$70,000

Lutheran Bible Translators (LBT) uses literacy programs within the local language communities to give people the skills to read the newly translated Bible which results in a personal relationship with God. When they can read God's Word in their local or heart language, they know that God speaks their language and hears their prayers. Local personnel in Ethiopia and Sierra Leone, identified as partners with LBT, help teach their people. The long distances between the language communities have treacherous and hazardous terrain. The money from this grant will help purchase robust, reliable vehicles. Trainers will be able to travel to God's people who are waiting for the opportunity to learn to read the saving words of the Gospel in their heart language. This will impact multiple language groups in both countries.




Literacy programs funded by Lutheran Bible Translators generally have 400-900 students. As Scripture is translated into the local languages, both the young and old need to be taught how to read it.

A durable vehicle is needed as road erosion and potholes are a common sight in Africa and increases the wear and tear of a vehicle.



Local bridges are better than no bridges, but some can be challenging to cross. This bridge is one of the better built ones compared to others.



This is a songbook in Amharic, a language in Ethiopia. Can you imagine trying to read this? That is how the local communities feel when they can't read God's Word. Literacy and Scripture Use programs are necessary. Vehicles are necessary to reach the people living in the remote areas. Put God's Word in their hands.


