Life Light Psalms

**Psalm 95:1 - "Oh come, let us sing to the LORD;
let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!"**

Psalms is a central book in the Bible, both literally and in character to the Christian faith. It is part of the wisdom literature, containing poetry and songs. Many have said that the book of Psalms is the hymnal of the Old Testament - the Songs of the Church. Luther believed hymns were important for the Church, so much so that he nearly had the whole Psalter memorized! The Songs of the Church have a unique importance for the life of faith. Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs help us dwell in the word of God richly, and fill our hearts with melody. Colossians 3:16 exhorts us to speak to one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, thanking God. This month our Sunday Morning Bible Class will be studying selected Psalms using resources from the Life Light Series from CPH. Come, let us speak to one another, and sing to the LORD!



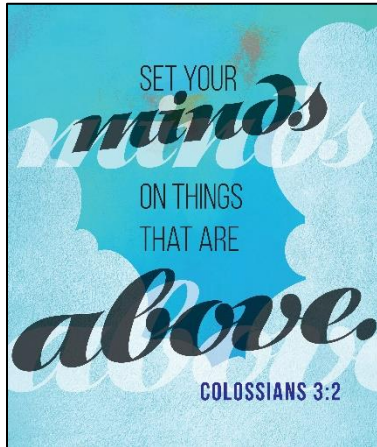
You might be surprised at the variety within the book of Psalms. The book of Psalms contains a variety of individual psalms written by a number of different writers, in many different forms. Some are prayers, some are didactic, some are laments, and some are captured moments in the life of faith of those who have gone before us. Learning more about both the Psalter and our hymnal can help us in our own lives, and build our faith. We can learn to put hymns and the psalms to practice and use them effectively in our daily lives.

Many of the psalms are messianic and point us to Christ and His life for us. Some have suggested that most of Christ's words from the cross are quotes from the Psalms. If Christ used the psalter to endure the trials of the cross, perhaps we can use them to help us as well! Please join us on Sunday mornings at 10:30 in the Parish Hall Meeting Room to study and consider the Songs of the Church together.

New Year's New Self

"If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory" (Col. 3:1-4).



Where is your mind this holiday season? It is the time of year now that many reflect back on the previous year and plan ahead for the next. New Year's resolutions can excite us for the changes that we can make to make the next year better than the last. We want to improve! We want to self-improve! But why are we wanting to improve? It can be easy to remove Jesus from the picture when we are making plans. After all, what do New Year's resolutions have to do with Jesus?

The entire Christian life, however, is a picture of improvement in some ways. It is a picture of renewal and growth. That is not to say that we cannot set New Year's resolutions. In fact, we can get more excited about setting them, if we understand why we want to change.

"Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry... In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek

and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all" (Col. 3:5, 7-11).

In many ways, if this were a New Year's resolution list, it would be dauntingly hefty, but there is comfort! We are not on our own! As Colossians 3:3 points out, we have died, and our lives are now hidden in Christ. In Christ, we are renewed. In Christ, we are able to put off the old self. It is certainly not easy, and—like many New Year's resolutions—we are sure to fail here and there. When we fail, however, we can rest assured that in Christ, we are a new creation, and in him, there is forgiveness and hope as we grow daily.

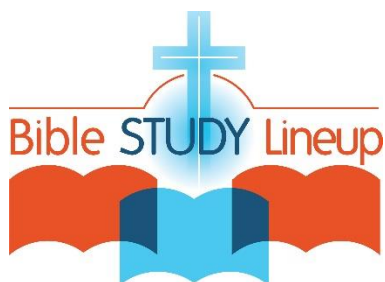
So, as we look forward to 2024, let us keep our minds fixed on Jesus—who He is, what He has done for us, and what He will continue to do in us during the next year!

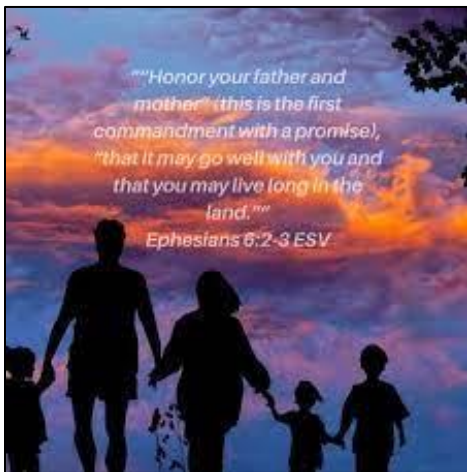
Sunday School Volunteer Information

January 2024 ~ LCMS Stewardship Article

“The Chief Stewards of Humanity: Mom and Dad”

St. Paul tells the Ephesians that the first commandment with a specific promise attached to it is, “Honor your father and mother so that it may go well with you, and you may live long in the land” (Eph. 6:2). This promise is one indication of the importance of this commandment. The other thing that highlights the special nature of this commandment is its placement within the Ten Commandments.



The Ten Commandments are clearly organized in two big categories. The first three commandments deal with our relationship with God. This category is called the First Table of the Law. The last seven commandments, the Second Table of the Law, tell us how we should relate to other people. These two tables correspond to what Jesus calls the two greatest commandments: “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind,” and “You shall love your neighbor as yourself” (Matt. 22:37–39).

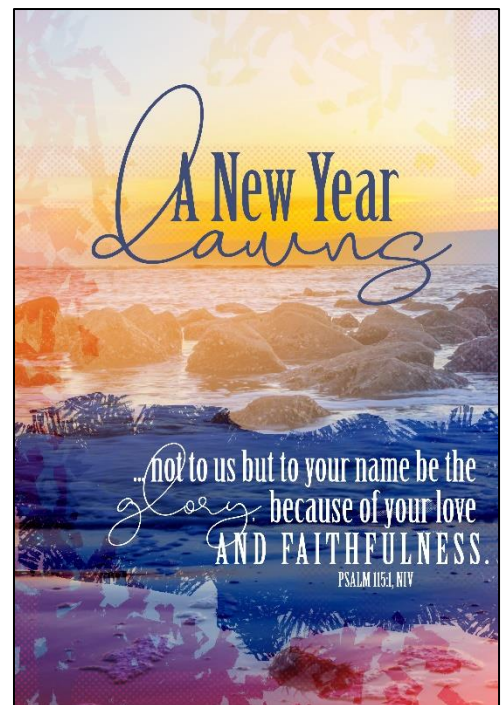
The order of the Second Table of the Law is also important. Murder is a greater sin than adultery, which is a greater sin than stealing, or lying, or coveting. But why is the Fourth Commandment first in the Second Table, ahead of “you shall not murder”? Is disobeying your parents really worse than murder? Or maybe we should give up on thinking these commandments are ordered?

The overall effect of this order is to get us to see our parents as a connection point between our neighbors and our God. Throughout our upbringing our father and mother stand between us and God and deliver His gifts to us: God clothes us, feeds us, protects us and teaches His Word to us through our parents.

So, parents have a very high calling from God. They are called to be stewards of the greatest gift: the gift of life.

Parenting thus gives us a keen insight into all our stewardship. Parents know that they have been given a great treasure in their children, a treasure that does not belong to them, yet for which they feel a great deal of responsibility. Truth be told, every gift we have been given is like this, because everything we have — whether our own personal skills and powers or our wealth and time — is all from God. He entrusts it all to us so that we can use it all and take care of it all for His great purposes.

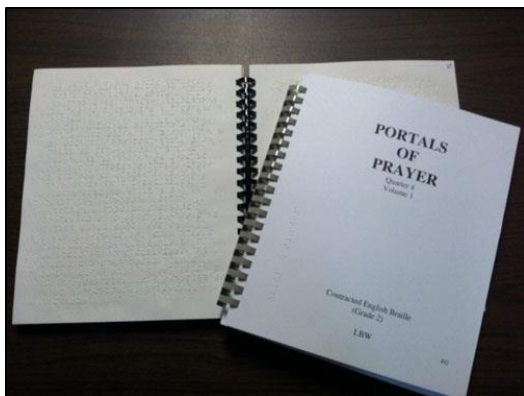

Grant #4 — Fortifying Faith in Those with
Vision Impairment**

Lutheran Braille Workers - \$100,000

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) has the opportunity to reach individuals with visual impairment who live in spiritual darkness with the hope and salvation of Jesus Christ. There are millions of people around the world who are blind or visually impaired. They seek to strengthen their Christian faith while coping with isolation and dealing with physical, mental, and spiritual struggles. They often find it difficult to access Scripture-based reading materials.

This grant will provide LBW the opportunity to produce and add to their library 50 to 100 Scripture-based topical materials in Braille and specialized large print to help meet the spiritual and emotional needs of people who are visually impaired. Because LBW works with every Christian denomination, these materials would be available for outreach and evangelism at no cost to those who are blind or visually impaired regardless of faith or belief.

Daily and monthly devotional materials are among the most requested items from individuals throughout the United States in Braille and Large Print. The opportunity to study God's Word each day was considered "a joy unlike any other in the world" according to one woman who has limited vision and reads Large Print.

Collections of hymns are extremely popular at senior care facilities as they are often the songs everybody knows. One facility increased their chapel attendance from 10 people a morning to over 60 people simply by bringing in "Favorite Hymns" in Large Print which the men and women were finally able to read in order to sing along.

My Birthday Gift for Christ / Zion Lutheran School Scholarship

- Whereas, God in His grace and mercy has called us into His kingdom to be encouragers of children and to be workers together with Him;
- Whereas, a Christian education for children helps bring them up in the care and admonition of the Lord;
- Whereas, the love of Christ should constrain us, and it is also our duty, as members of God's kingdom, to do our part in helping men and women to prepare themselves for professional church work;
- Whereas, there is a great shortage of men and women who devote their whole time in the service of the Lord; and,
- Whereas, there are, no doubt, many men and women who would gladly offer themselves to become pastors, teachers, or some other professional church workers, if they had the funds to prepare themselves for this service; therefore,
- Be it resolved that
 - A two-part scholarship fund be established to be known as "My Birthday Gift for Christ / Zion Lutheran School Scholarship",
 - Every member of Zion Lutheran Church, Snohomish, Washington, be encouraged to make a donation each year on his or her birthday toward this scholarship in any amount he or she chooses.

"My Birthday Gift for Christ"

Purpose: The purpose of this scholarship is to promote Christian leadership by encouraging and helping individuals embark on or advance in a career of professional church work. Annual financial grants will be made to qualified applicants who have been motivated by the Holy Spirit to enroll in a program of higher education which leads to doing God's work.

Eligibility: To be eligible for an award, the applicant must be a present member of Zion Lutheran Church, Snohomish, Washington or a former member confirmed at Zion Lutheran Church, Snohomish, Washington. The applicant must have made application, be enrolled, or accepted for enrollment in one of the institutions of higher education of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and in pursuit of an undergraduate or graduate degree. The applicant should exhibit a desire to enter professional church work within The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (the ministry, teaching, or other pursuits whose acceptability will be judged by the Selection Committee) upon completion of his or her education.

Selection Committee: The Selection Committee will be the Board of Stewardship of the congregation. This committee will review all applications, interview applicants, solicit additional information if needed, and make the awards. The Selection Committee will call on the Pastor(s) and others for guidance in making the awards. The information in the applications will be considered confidential and disclosure will be limited to those individuals considered essential to reach a fair decision.

Application Procedure: The Selection Committee/Board of Stewardship will publish notice to congregation members during the month of January each year that applications are being received for awards for the following school year from the "MY BIRTHDAY GIFT FOR CHRIST" Scholarship. Applications must be received by the Selection Committee by April 1. The applications will be reviewed during the month of April with awards being announced no later than May 15. Note: scholarship awards are normally made on an annual basis and can only be renewed by filing a new application each year.

The Selection Committee may consider applications submitted at other times than those specified when extraordinary circumstances justify such action.

The applicant should address the Selection Committee/Stewardship Board by letter with the following information:

1. Education status.
2. Educational plans for the next school year, including acceptance status.
3. Congregational status.
4. A brief statement of career plans and goals including the professional church work area the applicant desires to enter.

5. An indication of financial need (the Selection Committee is not requesting a financial statement of the family — rather, it would like an indication of the applicant's need relative to other applicants. Information such as anticipated costs, sources of income, part-time employment, etc, should be included.)
6. Any other information which the applicant believes would be useful to the Selection Committee. (Note: special situations where full compliance with the eligibility statement above is not met may be considered and should be justified here.)

Award Procedure: The total amount of the awards made in any one year shall not exceed the amount in the “MY BIRTHDAY GIFT FOR CHRIST” Scholarship account.

Individual awards will be decided by the Selection Committee on the basis of the total amount available, number of applicants, and the needs of the applicants. Awards will not necessarily be of equal amounts, nor will all eligible applicants necessarily receive an award. The maximum amount of award per individual applicant per year is \$3,500.00. (Not to exceed 50% of the annual amount of tuition, fees, and books.)

Awards will be announced by letter to the applicant and will be paid directly to the applicant's seminary or college before the school term starts, but only after the applicant's acceptance to or continuation in the seminary or college has been confirmed in writing.

“Zion Lutheran School Scholarship”

Purpose: The purpose of this scholarship is to aid children of members of Zion Lutheran Church of Snohomish, Washington, to attend Zion Lutheran School. Annual financial grants will be made to qualified applicants.

Eligibility: To be eligible for an award, the applicant child must be a present member of Zion Lutheran Church, Snohomish, Washington.

Selection Committee: The Selection Committee will be the Board of Stewardship of the congregation. This committee will review all applications and make the awards. The Selection Committee will call on the Pastor(s) and others for guidance in making the awards. The information in the applications will be considered confidential and disclosure will be limited to those individuals considered essential to reach a fair decision.

Application Procedure: The Selection Committee/Board of Stewardship will publish notice to congregation members during the month of January each year that applications are being received for awards for the following school year from the “ZION LUTHERAN SCHOOL” Scholarship. Applications must be received by the Selection Committee by April 1. The applications will be reviewed during the month of April with awards being announced no later than May 15. Note: scholarship awards are normally made on an annual basis and can only be renewed by filing a new application each year.

The Selection Committee may consider applications submitted at other times than those specified when extraordinary circumstances justify such action.

The applicant parent(s) should address the Selection Committee/Stewardship Board by letter requesting the “ZION LUTHERAN SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP” and stating their congregational status.

Award Procedure: The total amount of the awards made in any one year shall not exceed the amount in the “ZION LUTHERAN SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP” account.

Individual awards will be decided by the Selection Committee on the basis of the total amount available and the number of applicants. Awards will not necessarily be of equal amounts, nor will all eligible applicants necessarily receive an award. The maximum amount of award per individual applicant per year is \$1,000.00.

Awards will be announced by letter to the applicant and will be paid directly to ZION LUTHERAN SCHOOL before the school term starts, but only after the applicant child's acceptance to or continuation in the school has been confirmed in writing.

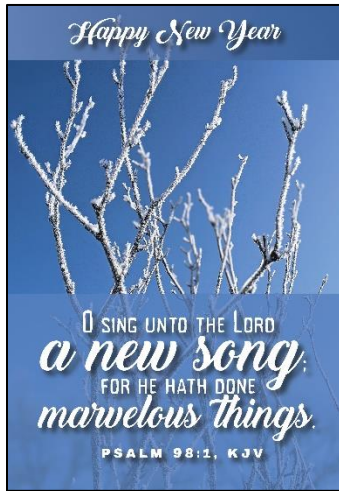
