Zion Church Dedication Tomorrow

Tomorrow's the big day for Zion Lutheran Church as they dedicate their new church.

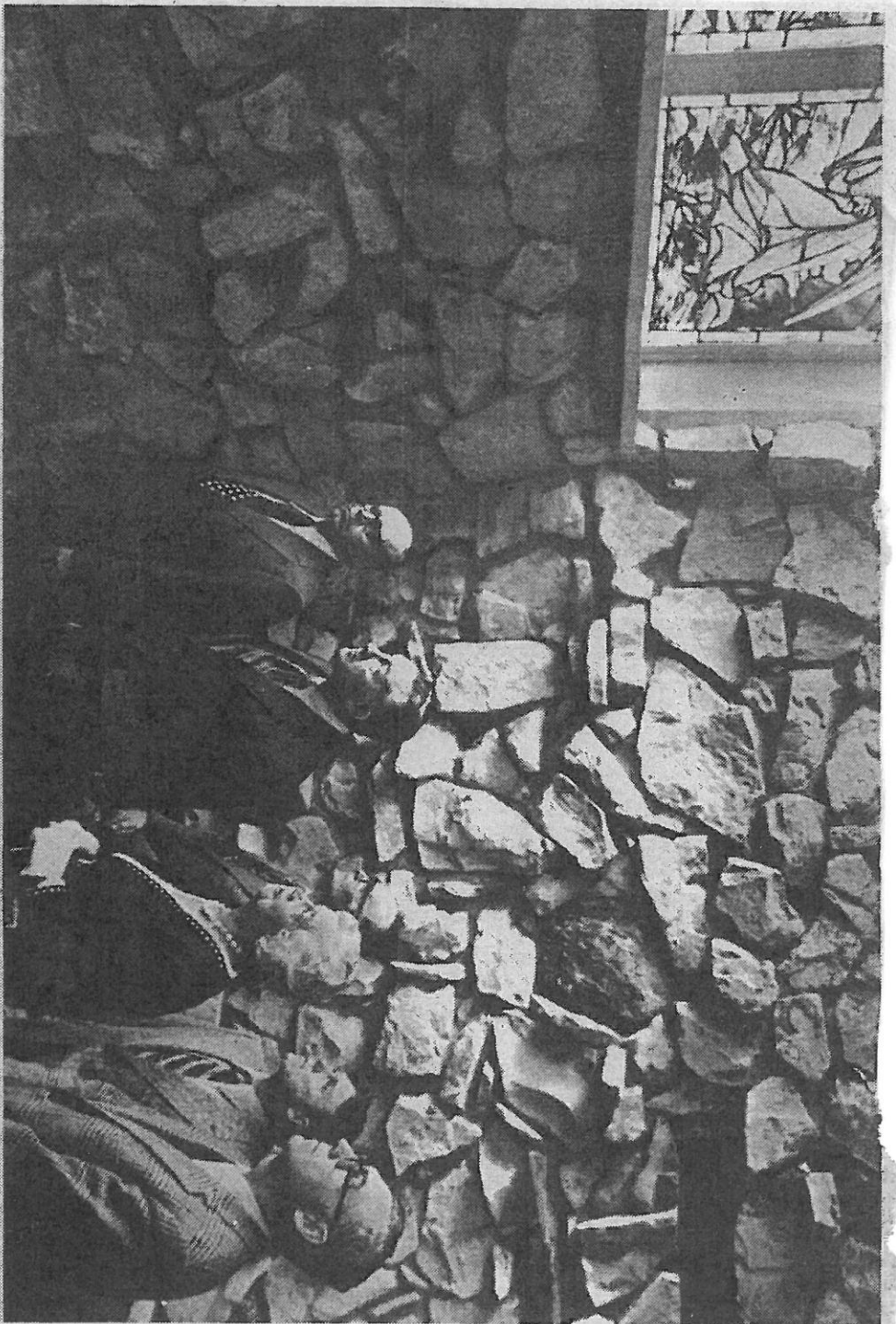
The congregation will meet in front of the church's educational building on High Street and then walk in line to the new church and sanctuary unit. The dedication service is slated for 10 a.m. after the 8-45 Sunday School.

At the door of the new building they will pause for the Service of Entrance, then proceed into the sanctuary for the remainder of the service.

Guest preacher of the morning service will be Dr. Fred Moenser, President of the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Columbus.

At noon the members of the congregation will have a covered dish dinner and then two separate services are slated, one in the afternoon and the other in the evening, for the community to come in and see the new structure.

Those services will begin at 3 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. and will be followed by open houses.
