Jesus is Still Lord in 2021

Well thank God 2020 is over with! What a challenging year. 2020 seemed to be a year that tried to steal our hope and our joy and leave us with only loneliness and despair.

But now it is gone. It is in the rearview mirror. It is hindsight. 2020 hindsight.

Because 2021 is upon us and it is our immediate future, and hope is still alive in 2021 because Jesus is still alive, and he is still our King. Even a year as awful as 2020 couldn't keep Jesus down. The church in 2020 had many fits and starts across the globe, but it is still here, it is still proclaiming the Word of God, it is still bringing in new members, making disciples and shining the light of Christ in the dark places to expose and to reveal.

As some state governments tried to shut down places of worship, the church responded through technology by live streaming or recording worship so those now isolated at home would be able to worship together online or simply worship at home. In the next week or so, Zion will be installing some technology that will enable it to live-stream worship on FaceBook and other platforms. This technology should eliminate any issues we have had with sound as well. We will continue to broadcast on WCSM in 2021 because there are many who listen and worship with Zion through the radio broadcast.

Still other congregations in this nation practiced civil disobedience and exercised legal remedies and the courts finally agreed with the congregations. I give thanks to God for the courage these congregations have had in sticking their necks out to see what our constitutional protections really are in the United States.

Social distancing became the watch word for in-person worship. We will probably continue this practice all through 2021, unless the vaccines make a significant impact on the state, national and global levels of infection. So, our pews will continue to be alternately open-closed-open, our offering plates will continue to sit at the entrance to the main Sanctuary rather than be passed in the pews, and our bulletins will continue to be laid out for worshippers to pick up before they enter the Sanctuary.

What did we learn about Covid in 2020? We learned it couldn't stop the church. We learned that the gospel will still be proclaimed – sometimes in new and creative ways. We learned that Covid can't stop Jesus and his redeeming work. We learned that even as we quarantine Jesus is with us, we are not truly alone. And we learned that the work of the church continues as we persist in our focus on Mission, as we receive the body and blood of Jesus, and as we continue to baptize people into the Trinity and make disciples.

It's 2021 and the Church is open for business – the Lord's business. Thank you for your continued support of the Church, and of Zion Lutheran – St Marys, OH. This is a new year to share a message about new life. Praise be to God!

Zion Men's Workshop

Attention all Zion men: We got off to a pretty good (but slow) start last year and then got interrupted by a church building flood and Covid concerns. Well...

We're, back up and moving again for 2021.

Some of you joined in over the past year and we certainly look forward to your continued participation. If you haven't joined in yet, you are very welcome to come find out what we're all about.

What are we about?

Zion Men's Workshop is the name of both the Christian men's organization AND our real workshop facility. Our purposes are to:

- 1 - Promote FELLOWSHIP with regularly scheduled gatherings as well as informal shop time,
- 2 - Maintain a WORKSHOP FACILITY and tools for members in doing their own projects on their own time and occasional shared service projects,
- 3 - SHARE hands-on skills, techniques, and experiences through personal assistance, discussion, and encouragement, and
- 4 - Provide physical (or practical) SUPPORT to others in our congregation and our community.

So, we have monthly meetings (usually on the 3rd Sunday evening each month) and we'll soon have workshop hours through the week for members to work on their own projects (build something, fix your toaster, whittle, whatever) or just have a cup of coffee and a doughnut with other members.

We are just starting to get our workshop assembled in the lower level of the church educational wing so there are things to do there (benches, tool organization and storage, a coffee and doughnut table, etc.). Also, as mentioned before, the NALC has provided the funds for a disaster relief trailer and has asked us to provide labor to fit it out with cabinets and storage and tools at their expense. The empty trailer is on order. So, this isn't just a future vision, it's here and there are things to do right now!

All previous Workshop members are invited to return and we encourage other men to join us as well. At our monthly meetings, we conduct business, update our project progress, and have fun sharing the good company of Christian men. At our next meeting, we'll also have an informal presentation on basic characteristics of how wood grows and how lumber behaves.

- Rags/sponges



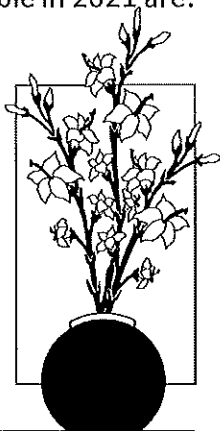
You may supply one or more of the items for the buckets, or you may assemble a bucket yourself. Drop off your supplies or bucket by the church elevator.

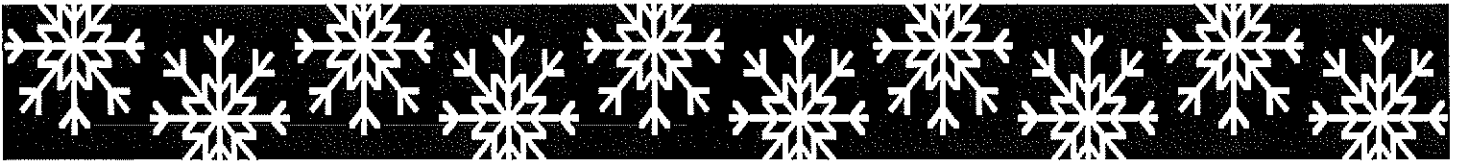

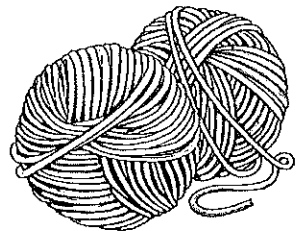

And God welcomes our cries of pain and sorrow, offering the Spirit's help when words fail us (Romans 8:26).

But through the ages, many deeply faithful followers of Christ have practiced contemplative prayer, centering prayer and other forms of stillness before God. Danish theologian Søren Kierkegaard (1813-1855) expressed it this way: "To pray does not mean to listen to oneself speaking. Prayer involves becoming silent, and being silent, and waiting until God is heard."
