Preparing Ourselves for Lent

There is no denying that Winter is here. The snow that came down on January 23rd and 24th and the cold temps that dipped to near zero, with wind chills in the minus teens, have announced through these signs that Winter has come. No one in Ohio doubts it.

I wish everyone in Israel had recognized the signs of the coming Messiah so that there had been no doubt when Jesus read from the scroll in the synagogue in Nazareth. So that we could all rejoicing with one another that our sins are forgiven and that the promise of eternal life has been extended to us by God's grace.

Oh, wait, we still can rejoice over that, because even as blind as we in this world might be, the church still sheds the gospel light upon us, calling us into worship and study and teaching and prayer, and most especially, into the promises the sacraments, of forgiven sins and life eternal.

The gospel calls us to all of this because without it we would be lost in our sins whose consequence is condemnation and death. All of us are sinners and all of us are in need of forgiveness. This comes to us in an attitude of repentance – the recognition of our need for God's help and grace. So, for our midweek Lenten worship we will be centered on the theme of repentance. The theme is called 'Return to the Lord' and is taken from Joel 2:13 — "Return to the LORD your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster."

God's invitation for us to return to him, and promise of his grace, mercy, patience and steadfast love, finds its fullness in Jesus Christ. Following different events during our Lord's Passion we will focus on the people that followed Jesus to see how God calls his people to return to him. He is our worship schedule for Midweek Lent, 2022.


I hope you will mark these dates in your calendar and join us for these services. May you also make repentance an intentional attitude for yourself this Lenten season.

News for the Women of Zion

Mark your calendars for February 20, at 2 p.m. That is when we will be holding our Celebration of Women Event. Do you know the three types of Queens in the Bible? How many Queens in the Bible can you name? Come enjoy an afternoon tea celebrating Queens in the Bible and present day. A light lunch will be served. The cost is \$5 per person. Tickets go on sale January 30 to February 13. *Please note: this event replaces the*

women's celebration usually held in April because of the closeness to Easter the date has been changed.

Our Lenten Fundraiser will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 2, and run through April 16. Envelopes will be handed out on Ash Wednesday. We ask that you put 50 cents in the envelope each day except Sundays during Lent, for a total of 40 days. This can co-inside with your daily devotions. We will collect the envelopes on Easter Sunday. This is the women's only fundraiser to help cover the costs of our events, to purchase supplies for mission kits and quilts, to help with funeral memorials and miscellaneous items in our budget. Your support is needed and greatly appreciated.

Our next workday is Thursday, February 17, at 9 a.m. We will no longer be sending kits and quilts to Lutheran World Relief. All of our donations will be going to the NALC as their mission is helping Americans in need when disaster strikes. LWR is allowing Arab countries to take credit for kits being supplied by Christians and we do not agree with this policy. The people receiving kits from Christian organizations should be told who the kits are coming from, not that Muslim leaders are providing them. Therefore, will no longer be doing baby kits, but the NALC will accept packaged disposable baby diapers and baby blankets. In place of the baby kits, the women's board has decided to collect items for Samaritan's Purse Christmas boxes. We will include these items on the list of items for personal care kits and school kits.
