Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Sixth Sunday of Easter - May 22, 2022

"I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."

-John 16:33-

This verse from the Gospel of John, chronicles the last words of Jesus to his disciples before his arrest. And last words carry a lot of weight. Jesus, fully knowing the events to come in his death and resurrection, and the trials his disciples will face as they remain in the world and carry on his mission, forewarns, comforts, and teaches (see chs. 13–16).

Jesus lovingly prepares and strengthens his disciples for what is to come. He knew the fear and devastation his disciples would experience with his death. And he knew they needed to know that his death on the cross was the gateway to victory and life for him and all who believed, and not the gateway to defeat and death.

So, Jesus proclaims he will return to them (see 16:16). And not only will he return alive, having conquered sin and death, he promises to, one day take them to himself, "that where I am you may be also" (14:3b). In the meantime, he assures them, "I will not leave you as orphans" (14:18). "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper" (14:16), the Holy Spirit to dwell within them (14:17).

So many promises arising from what looked like utter defeat as Jesus' life ebbed away on the cross. But not even death or the powers of hell could defeat him (see Heb. 2:14). So, in his last words before his arrest, Jesus assures his disciples that, although they remain in the world for a while longer and experience tribulation, they will simultaneously live in him who has overcome the world. And this changes everything that really matters.

Yes, they, like Jesus, will suffer persecution and, for some, even death (see 15:20). But, in Christ, the crosses they bear become the gateway to victory and life (see Matt. 10:38–39). And, remaining in Christ throughout it all brings peace and the courage to continue his mission on earth no matter what the cost.

Jesus gives us the same promises he gave his first disciples. We too can experience peace in him in the midst of persecution and death because, in him, they become the gateway to victory and eternal life.

Cradle Roll: The Women of Zion, in conjunction with the Sunday School, are starting up the CRADLE ROLL here at Zion. CRADLE ROLL is a ministry for the families of infants and toddlers. During the first three years of a child's life, resources and encouragement are sent to parents on a regular schedule. A certificate is sent at birth, baptismal information, birthday cards, Bible story books and a Sunday School invitation at three years of age. Statistics show that

by the time a child reaches school age most of what he/she will become, his/her character and values, are already formed. In the years the child is enrolled in the CRADLE ROLL, he/she is brought in contact with love and Christian influence which will help mold his/her entire life, thus making his/her world a better place to live. Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Seventh Sunday of Easter - May 29, 2022

"I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me."

-John 17:23-

Eternal life in God's kingdom, we sometimes long for it like a homesick child longs for home. We dream of living in the beauty and perfection of his kingdom where love saturates our souls and everything around us, and where we enjoy God's continual manifest presence. How well we know that we're not there yet. However, Jesus' prayer in John 17 reveals God's ardent desire for us before we pass into eternity: He desires eternal life for us now!

How do we experience it now? It starts with Jesus revealing the glory of the Father to all people (see Jn. 1:14) thus enabling continuous, direct, personal knowledge and oneness with the Father for us who believe. And this knowledge of the Father through Jesus and the ordering of our life according to that knowledge is eternal life (see Jn. 17:3).

And, as we live/abide in unity with God (see Jn. 15:1-17) and in unity with one another through Christ, we become the vehicles of God's presence in the world. In this way the world comes to know him.

So, we can partially partake in the beauty of God's kingdom even now by experiencing continual personal, loving relationship with God and each other (oneness) as we abide in God and express our love for him in obedience (see 14:21).

What does this obedience look like? Jesus tells us in John 13:34, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another." And we know Jesus' love for us took him to the cross. We are to love such that we are willing to lay our lives down for one another.

The Gospel of Matthew says it this way, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (16:24). Jesus then promises us, "For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (16:25).

Feeling homesick for eternity? Remember God's gift for you through Jesus Christ, and let that inspire you to love others. It is a glimpse of the eternity that is to come.
