As we enter the month of July and what is the very heart of Summer, we at Zion continue to share Jesus with our community and the world. We also continue to worship him with our hearts and pray that he will always remain the treasure that resides in our hearts and the light that shines through us and guides our path in this part of the world.

This July will introduce some change for us as we welcome a worship assistant, and as we say goodbye to a style of worship.

First, beginning the first Sunday in July, Ms. Heldi Yahl will begin assisting me in the leading of worship. Many of you know Heldi already as she has grown up in this congregation and is an active member of Zion. A year ago, she accepted my offer to help with the Confirmation Program and was one of three adults and one high school student who were actively involved in the teaching of Confirmation for the 2021-2022 class.

As Confirmation wound down for the Summer Heidi expressed to me that she feels she is being called by the Lord to do more, and I am assisting her in her discernment process. She is exploring the possibility of some formalized theological schooling. .

One of the outcomes of this process is that she will assist with worship beginning July 3rd for both services. She will not administer the Sacraments of Baptism or Holy Communion but will be a lay worship assistant and will lead us in many of the prayers spoken in our liturgy. In addition, she will be leading us in the responsive prayers. Please extend to Heidi your encouragement and support as she continues in her discernment process.

Second, for the past nine years we have been fortunate to have Mrs. Debbie Brown play the keyboard for us for our Praise Service, held on the third Sunday of each month at 10:30am. This month will mark Debbie's last Sunday playing the keyboard for this service as she is stepping down.

This has caused me to re-evaluate the service itself and our ability to lead such a service. In that process it became evident to me that Zion hasn't been gifted with the musicians we need to continue this style of worship, and so I asked the Congregational Council for permission to drop the service after this month. The Council agreed.

Therefore, beginning in August, the third Sunday of each month will become a liturgical service like our other Sunday worship services. We are grateful to everyone who played instruments or helped to sing at this service over the years. We will continue to make a joyful noise to the Lord each and every Sunday!

May the Lord bless each of you with a safe and fun summer!


A Special Thanks


The Power of Kindness

Now consider what happens when Christians won't volunteer at the church, won't give, won't practice their faith, won't love their neighbors. Both our country and our faith need sincere practitioners. Nationally, we need a citizenry committed to making the ideals of liberty the practices of life in America. Christianity needs followers of Jesus committed to making the ideals of God's kingdom the practices of daily life.



This is not an either-or situation. Christians everywhere are citizens of two countries, one on earth and one in eternity. The kingdom of God is not yet fully come, but it's already in effect. Our two citizenships can neither be fully united nor fully separated. We cannot withdraw from the world and pretend we are somehow dwelling only in the kingdom of God now; nor can we simply embrace the world and assume earthly governments fulfill God's will. Those are extremes, and they are unbiblical.
