Today, Tomorrow & Forever

Dear Zion Member,

Grace to you and peace this October.

The North American Lutheran Church (NALC) has identified a strategy for future growth and sustainability in its Vision 2020 documents. As part of its Vision 2020, the NALC initiated a challenge to its member congregations called: Today, Tomorrow & Forever (TTF). It is an opportunity for each of its member congregations to have a hand in making this strategy successful.

The goal of Today, Tomorrow & Forever is to raise five million dollars over the next three years, above what is already contributed in yearly giving. There are four comprehensive categories in TTF: **Grow**, **Serve**, **Renew** and **Fulfill**. They address more immediate opportunities as well as longer-term challenges.

Grow – We seek to grow in Discipleship, Church Plants, Spanish-Speaking Church Plants, and Stewardship. (\$1.6 million of the \$5 million)

Serve – We seek to develop The North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS), aid Pastoral Development, provide for the Call Process, expand Mission involvement, improve Youth and Family Ministries, excel in our ability to Communicate with our members and member congregations and provide resources for them to use as they carry out the mission of sharing the gospel with the world, sustain a Centralized NALC Office, and strengthen existing Missional and Ecumenical Relationships as well as establish new ones. (\$2.1 million of the \$5 million)

Renew – We plan "Fresh Eyes for Mission" summits through 2024 to identify the effectiveness of our missional practices, provide Congregational Mission and Renewal Grants so congregations are able to renew missional focus if such help is needed, and establish Worship Renewal Conferences for Pastors and Lay Leaders to explore best practices in the church. (\$800,000 of the \$5 million)

Fulfill – We recognize the many generations that faithfully served the Lord and proclaimed His deliverance, joining in His overarching mission of redeeming and renewing his creation. Through the 2020 Vision, our congregations devote themselves to join God in His work to Fulfill His promises, taking with them our call to discipleship and our core values as we continue the legacy of faith. So, we seek to address our Legacy, Our Purpose, Our Call to Discipleship and the Opportunities the Lord presents to us through the lens of our four Core Values: Being Christ Centered, Mission Driven, Traditionally Grounded, Congregationally Focused. (\$500,000 of the \$5 million).


Live Radio Broadcast
