Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

First Sunday after Christmas - January 1, 2023

"But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons."

- Galatians 4:4-5 -

As I have been in the vocation of motherhood for over a decade now, I find myself paying closer attention to messages – messages in television, books, or other media. I especially notice messages I prefer my kids not to hear. One message I have heard this time of year in movies and t.v. ads is, "Christmas is really for the children." Well, yes, there are many parts of the Christmas season that are geared towards children, don't get me wrong. Who doesn't love a children's Christmas program at their church or seeing the excitement on a child's face as Christmas gets closer and closer? What bothers me about the message is the focus of it. Christmas is not about the children. Christmas is about God. It's the celebration of God choosing to come down to us in the flesh in form of Jesus Christ.

Everything about the birth of Christ is perfect because it was God's doing; it was in his own timing. God sent Jesus at just the right time, and God sent Jesus to the perfect place – a manger in Bethlehem. God did this to sanctify the world, to redeem us, who were under the law. And he did this in order to make us his children, his sons and daughters. To live as God's children would be impossible without Christmas. Before Christ came, we were all under the law, and that's tough! To live under the law means to live under God as judge, not as Father.

Under the law, we face eternal death and separation from God. Under the law, we are guilty of sin. So our only hope is in Christ Jesus, our Savior. When the time was right, God sent Jesus, born of the virgin Mary. He was sent under the law to fulfill the law's demands. Why? So we could be children of God. Christmas isn't about the children at all. Christmas is about Jesus Christ, who has made us children of God, adopted by God as his own.

Martin Luther writes in his Small Catchism: "God encourages us to believe that he is truly our Father, and that we are truly his children, so that we may boldly and confidently pray to him, just as beloved children speak to their dear father." May we be grateful for the love our Father has for us.
