# The Lies of those in Power will Never Suppress the Truth Forever

Matthew 28:<sup>1</sup> "Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. <sup>2</sup> And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. <sup>3</sup> His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. <sup>4</sup> And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. <sup>5</sup> But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. <sup>6</sup> He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. <sup>7</sup> Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. See, I have told you."

Matthew 28:<sup>11</sup> "While they were going, behold, some of the guard went into the city and told the chief priests all that had taken place. <sup>12</sup> And when they had assembled with the elders and taken counsel, they gave a sufficient sum of money to the soldiers <sup>13</sup> and said, "Tell people, 'His disciples came by night and stole him away while we were asleep.' <sup>14</sup> And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble." <sup>15</sup> So they took the money and did as they were directed. And this story has been spread among the Jews to this day."

It should come as no great surprise to us that those in power lie to the people about a great many things. We know it happens today, and it happened back in Jesus day. The gospel of Matthew reveals the lies those in power in the Temple - the Chief Priests and the Elders - conspired to hide the truth of Jesus' resurrection, conspired to bribe the Temple Guards who know the truth, and then conspired to spread misinformation to the community about what has occurred.

As I said, history is full of examples of this kind of behavior from those who rule over people. Examples of those in power trying to hide the truth from the people. We still see this happening today. The writer of Ecclesiastes put it this way: "What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done, and there is nothing new under the sun." (Ecclesiastes 1:9)

But my friends, the truth will always get out. No secret lasts forever. Jesus tells us in the gospel of Luke chapter 8 verse 17 – "For nothing is hidden that will not be made manifest, nor is anything secret that will not be known and come to light." Try as they might the good news of Jesus' resurrection from the dead could not be kept silent. The lie might be suppressed for a little while, but the truth will eventually come out, and will be made known.

Over the centuries all the efforts of those in power to cancel Jesus, to silence the truth of his resurrection from the dead, have failed. All the tactics of intimidation and threats that have been made over time have not stopped the truth from being passed along in each generation. I believe the good news for the salvation of mankind is

that those in power will never be able to completely stamp out the truth about Jesus and his resurrection and its implications for us.

And so I encourage us to give thanks to the Father that the good news about his Son Jesus will continue to be spoken and shared and believed in until he returns. The harvest of souls for the kingdom of God will continue, regardless of the efforts of this world to stop it, until Christ returns to judge the living and the dead on the last day.

May this truth guide you each day in the living out your faith.


