Easter Lasts for More than One Day

He is Risen! He is Risen, indeed!

Easter morning has come and gone, and yet Easter remains with us each day, because every day is a new day to celebrate and rejoice in the fact that the crucified Jesus has been resurrected from death and the tomb. This is the truth we both claim and rest in — each day! The power of death has been defeated and the imprisonment of the grave has been escaped for good, because of the crucified Jesus' resurrection from death and the tomb.

Are you living today with the attitude of Easter every day you wake up? Do you perceive the world, your home life, your work or school environment with the knowledge and joy of Easter morning? If not, why not? Easter morning changed everything about our existence and clarified God's love for us. Rejoice in it each day. 



May Loose Offering

Our loose offerings each Sunday/Wednesday for the month of May is earmarked for the Oesterlen Services for Youth in Springfield, Ohio. Since its founding in 1903, Oesterlen's single objective has been to serve children and their loved ones. We are a mental health treatment and social services agency serving youth and families. Our full range of services includes residential mental health treatment, foster care, outpatient counseling, inhome programs, and in-school programs.

Kitchen Property Receipts/Disposal

All items in the kitchen/kitchen cupboards are affected by this policy. This includes tableware, cups, silverware, cookware, roasters, mixers, cast iron skillets, etc. that we presently own. This policy will include items donated to the church kitchen.

The kitchen chairperson and the executive board of the Women of Zion, (President, Secretary, and Treasurer) will decide whether the items should be placed in the kitchen or be at their disposal.

Questions to be asked when accepting/disposing of the kitchen/kitchenette items: Is it something we need and can use? Is the item in good condition? Do we have a place to store the item? Is it a duplicate? Is it just taking up space?

If the decision has been made to dispose of the kitchen equipment, then a date is to be decided to put the equipment on display in Narthex or by alley entrance for members to take (at no charge.) If the items are in good condition and not taken from the display table after a two week period, they can be given to a charitable organization for disposal.

The Kitchen Ministry Team Representative will share in the monthly checking of the kitchen and responsibilities as listed below. Items that need to be purchased i.e. condiments, broken items, etc. are to be replaced and bills submitted to the church office. If kitchen is found messy please report it to the office, 419-394-3115.

Assigned members will be responsible for monthly cleaning and checking of refrigerators and defrosting the kitchenette refrigerator. Monthly checking means to see that things are in place, and articles in the first aid kit are replenished according to the list on the first aid box. The coffee pot must be emptied and thoroughly washed.

The kitchen should be checked weekly for neatness, leftover food and used towels. Please launder all kitchen linens that are used and return them in a timely manner. The garbage disposal is to run for 10-15 minutes once a week. The ice cube trays need to be kept filled for the freezer to function properly. All sinks need to be thoroughly cleaned and no food particles left in the sink drain stopper. Clean any spills in the refrigerator.

All food and drink left over should not be allowed to stay in the kitchen unless another function can safely use the food, and that the Chairperson is informed. Please label all food items with date and name.


Anyone wishing to use kitchen items should first check with the church office, 419-394-3115, and assigned kitchen representative for approval. All items should be signed out in the kitchen. For weddings and other receptions which make use of the kitchen, arrangements should be made with the chairperson of the kitchen Ministry Team so that someone knowledgeable will be able to be

present to give directions or assistance. Each group using the kitchen facilities is to be responsible for cleaning following their activity and returning all equipment to its proper place.

The Women's Council members shall clean inside the cupboards, stove, etc., and inventory everything in June. Missing pieces will be listed and discussed at the Council meetings following the annual inventory.
