### You Can Help Others Get the Fresh Water they Need to Live!!

On Saturday, June 10<sup>th</sup>, at 10am, a group of people concerned about the quality of water many in the world are forced to drink and the dangers involved just to get that water in order to live, will meet at the Mill Park Shelter House in an effort to raise money for those in Mexico to have clean, safe, drinking water and proper sanitation facilities.

WaterMission is an non-profit organization that exists to provide expertise to communities that only have unsafe, unclean water to drink. Since 1998 the founders of WaterMission have been actively working to educate and train communities about the dangers of unsafe water and of the water purification systems they have developed for those communities. WaterMission has provided water purification systems all over the world and the local communities operate and manage each of those systems. Hundreds of thousands of lives have been saved because of the systems WaterMission has put in place around the world, including Mexico.

Mexico is home to 128 million people as of the 2020 census. It is made up of 38 States. I personally visited several communities in the State of Chiapas, Mexico several years ago. I visited with the people in those communities, I worshipped with them, and I saw the poor and dangerous quality of the water they had to drink, until the fresh, safe water that a WaterMission purification system provided them. It was amazing to hear the personal stories of many and to witness the difference fresh, safe water made in their lives and to the health and vitality of those communities as a whole.

Additionally, WaterMission also has safe affordable sanitation systems for the population in those communities to utilize, if they choose.

But, poverty is everywhere in Mexico and it is often difficult for communities to be able to afford the purchase and initial start-up of the water systems. This is where your donation helps. The money we send to WaterMission is ear-marked for WaterMission Mexico to use for water purification or for safe sanitation, whichever a community is in need for and would like.

Walk with us on June 10<sup>th</sup>. We will start at the Mill Park Shelter House off of High Street in Saint Marys at 10am. We will walk north alongside of the canal till we reach State Route 33. We will then fill our buckets with water from the canal and walk back to the Shelter House. The walk is approximately 1 mile long. There are many in the world who walk 3-5 miles to their nearest water source to get even dirty water from rivers, streams and bad wells. Along the way there are many dangers ranging from wild animals to robbers and thieves to murderers and infected outcasts. WaterMission water purification systems located right in the community makes getting fresh water safer and more convenient to everyone.

Ask your family and friends and those in your neighborhood or various clubs to help by walking with us and also by their generous contribution to help. Our goal this year is \$5,000. I hope we can reach that goal. With your help I know it is possible.



"Oh my goodness," she cries. "You forgot the toast!"


Moral: Every time we forget something, we're reminded that "outwardly we are wasting away." But thank the Lord that "inwardly we are being renewed day by day."
