So Many Ways to Grow in Christ Jesus

This month is a very active month at Zion. Already Confirmation Classes have started back up on Wednesday nights. We have seven youth involved in those classes and they are studying the Old Testament until Christmas and then the New Testament after Christmas.

Sunday school resumes with Rally Day on September 10th. The theme is Walk with Jesus. All the youth will meet in the Zion Auditorium, for the Kick-Off of Sunday School, at 9:15 a.m., that day.

The Crossroads Sunday school class will begin on September 10^{th,} in the Lounge, at 9:15 a.m. This class is a multigenerational class open to High School students and Adults of all ages. This class will be using the DVD "The Prodigal God' and will help us look at the Parable of the Prodigal Son. The sessions will follow this format: 1) The Parable 2) The People Around Jesus 3) The Two Lost Sons 4) The Elder Brother 5) The True Elder Brother 6) The Feast of the Father.

Bible studies resume.

First, the Woman's Fellowship Bible Study will meet once again on Monday nights beginning September 11th, at 7 p.m. They are always ready to welcome someone new to the group. They will continue their study of Exodus that ended last May, so bring your Bible and enjoy the fellowship time together. Women of all ages are welcome.

Second, a Bible Study being led by Becky Harvey will be offered two different times each week. One group will meet once a month on Wednesday evenings, at 7 p.m., beginning September 13th, in the lounge. A second group will meet once a month on Thursday afternoons, at 2 p.m. Both of these groups will meet in the Lounge on the first floor. The book 'Come Holy Spirit' is required for their study and must be ordered through the Church office at a cost of \$10 each.

Third, a Pastor led Bible Study will begin Monday September 11th, at 7 p.m., and will be held in the All-Purpose Room on the second floor of the Educational building. The study will utilize a DVD entitled "The Awe of God," a video led series that explores "the promises in Scripture that are given to those who embrace the fear of God." The sessions will discuss: 1) Holy Awe 2) Revealed as We Are 3) Irresistible Holiness 4) God's Word 5) Intimacy with God.

In addition to Sunday School and the Bible Studies being offered, our mission work continues as we develop Flood Buckets, Health Kits and School Kits and many other items for NALC Disaster Response. We also continue to prepare for the Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Drive in November.

We believe it is important for each member of Zion to read/study the Word of God on a daily basis in order to grow in relationship with God, in addition to attending worship each week. We believe that it is important for the members of Zion to be actively involved in the mission related activities of the Church, along with other missional work God may be calling each person to explore. I look forward to growing with you in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Report on 2023 NALC Convocation in Oklahoma City

The NALC Convocation was held from Wednesday, August 9, starting at 1:30 p.m., until Friday, August 11. Some interesting things I learned are there are now 490 congregations, and that number continues to grow. We also have 61 students in seminary. NALC is definitely growing.

We had many speakers from all around the world that we are in mission with.

The theme of the convocation devotional time was: On Fire for Mission Focus. Each day we started out with scripture reading, Bible Study with Dr. David Luv and then had time for discussion with groups around the table. It was very interesting. We also had workshops we could go to. I went to "Every Congregation Renewing: Real Life Processes and Strategies for Strengthening & Growing Congregations". It was very informational. Some of the information I found very interesting, was having a senior ministry, besides just a family ministry because we are an ageing population. Also, hearing about Fresh Eyes for congregations. I think Fresh Eyes could benefit us as a congregation.

We also did the business of the church. We reelected Rev. Dan Selbo as bishop and voted others into positions such as executive council. Most things were approved without much discussion. One of the items discussed was the money that we give to Lutheran World Relief as a mission partner. Lutheran World Relief was discussed, and there was a vote to take them out of the budget. That vote passed. It was then voted on and accepted that the executive council would explore another mission partner like LWR but who share the gospel as part as their mission.

In all it is a great group of people doing the work of the church. As it was said many times, we are in our teenage years, so it is quite interesting to be a part of something like this. We are still growing and so continually need to readjust. I would encourage others to attend our next convocation that will be held in 2025 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.



The Ohio Mission Region (OMR) was formed on May 9, 2015, to maintain state-wide unity when the former Ohio Mission District split into its current 5 districts. The OMR Council consists of the 5 deans of the new Ohio Mission Districts, 5 lay people (one from each district), a treasurer and a secretary. Deans acts as a convener for the meetings and annual convocation, but all share in the duties of the region.

The purpose for the regional council is to maintain contact between and among the districts located in Ohio and to serve as a coordinator for joint efforts. There are some outreach efforts and discipleship projects which require more than a few churches. When this is the case, the region serves as a point of organization and

Christian Symbol

STONE TABLETS — The tablets of stone symbolize God's giving of the Law to Israel through Moses on Mount Sinai (Horeb). They're often shown with Roman numerals I through III on the left tablet and IV through X on the right. This represents the Ten Commandments — with the first three focusing on God and the final seven focusing on other people. The image of the stone tablets also may represent the entire Old Testament.
