Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

All Saints Sunday - November 5, 2023

"After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!'"

-Revelation 7:9-10-

Over the years I've grown to have a greater appreciation for this holiday in our church year: All Saints Day. It's not as flashy as Christmas or Easter, but it certainly has its place on our calendar. And the older I get, the more I come to treasure these verses from Revelation, chapter 7.

The details that John gives us of his vision paints a picture of something we have neither seen nor experienced. "After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands." When I was a senior in college, my best friend and I took a road trip from Blair, Nebraska to New York City. New York City is where I discovered my dislike for crowds of people. It was raining, so the crowds of people had umbrellas, naturally. As we crossed streets near Times Square, we bumped into strangers, tripped over children, and got our umbrellas tangled with other umbrellas. For me it was a situation filled with chaos, anxiety, and stress. There was a multitude of people in New York City, too many to number. Many nations and cultures were represented as well. The scene that John describes

does not bring up images of chaos and anxiety. Rather, I feel at peace and full of hope. We will be reunited with all the believers in Christ who've gone before us. So what do we make of the white robes? The white robes signify baptism. Remember, Jesus said in Mark 16:16, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." These are them. They are the baptized believers in Christ, gathered together at the throne of God.

Together the believers in Christ from every tribe, every nation, and every point in history, gather together around the throne of God to worship. They cry out together that salvation is not their own. Salvation belongs to God and to his son Jesus Christ (Rev. 7:10). So as I get older, I think about the people, the saints, in my life who've gone on to the Church Triumphant. I think about this vision of John's. May we be filled with the peace of God that passes all of our own understanding.
