From Suffering and Mourning into Joyful Resurrection and Eternal Life

As this month of March begins we are still in the season of Lent, following Jesus on his 40 day journey to the cross, and his resurrection three days later.

With each stop on the journey, we are being connected to important elements that fit into the story. In February we heard about ashes, salt and water in connection to the scripture verses and stories of the first three weeks of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, the ashes reminded us of our need to clothe ourselves in humility and repent of our sins.

On Feb 21st, the salt reminds us Jesus Christ is with us now, sweetening and preserving all our lives. He also promises to vaccinate us from death, preserving us now and for eternity.

On Feb 28th, the water reminds us that it circulates throughout Scripture to wash, cleanse, flood, and reshape whatever it touches. Like a potter working with clay, our heavenly Father remodels us every day, conforming us more closely to the image of His Son, Jesus, with our baptismal water.

Now, in March, as we conclude Lent, we will hear about light, bread, palm branches, water and blood, and then finally, milk and honey.

On March 6th, the light reminds us Jesus Christ is the light of the world, who enlightens all who believe in Him. His light dispels sin and darkness and fills us with so much light and joy that we truly reflect His light to the world.

On March 13th, the bread reminds us Jesus is the true bread of life given by the Father to us. In Him, and only in Him, is life forgiven, meaningful, renewed, and satisfied.

On March 20th, the palm branches remind us as Christians to remain joyful and hope-filled even though life circumstances may change. All of God's people remain victorious, even amidst pain, adversity, trials, sin, and death. This is why palms hold a special place in the hearts of all the people of God.

On Maundy Thursday, the water and blood remind us that Jesus was baptized into death through water and blood, and on this night, we celebrate receiving the (new) testament which our Lord inaugurated in the Lord's Supper.

On Good Friday our Lord is crucified.

And on Easter Sunday, milk and honey reminds us of the Promised Land of God's eternal kingdom and of our eternal life in that kingdom.

If you have been joining us for midweek Lenten worship, I pray you follow spiritual discipline through to the end. If you haven't joined us yet, I encourage you to come and engage in this spiritual practice and then as you

celebrate Easter, reflect on these last few weeks of Lent to determine if it made Easter even more meaningful for you.




Lily Order Deadline




Seder Meal
